## A BILL

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 5122.04 and 5164.15 of the	7
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 5122.04. (A) Upon the request of a minor fourteen	9
years of age or older, a mental health professional may provide	10
outpatient mental health services, excluding the use of	11
medication, without the consent or knowledge of the minor's	12
parent or guardian. Except as otherwise provided in this <del>section</del>	13
division, the minor's parent or guardian shall not be informed	14
of the services without the minor's consent unless the mental	15
health professional treating the minor determines that there is	16
a compelling need for disclosure based on a substantial	17
probability of harm to the minor or to other persons, and if the	18
minor is notified of the mental health professional's intent to	19

inform the minor's parent, or guardian.		
(B)—Services provided to a minor pursuant to this section—	21	
division shall be limited to not more than six sessions or	22	
thirty days of services, whichever occurs sooner. After the	23	
sixth session or thirty days of services $_{m L}$ the mental health	24	
professional shall terminate the services or, with the consent	25	
of the minor, notify the parent, or guardian, to obtain consent	26	
to provide further outpatient services.	27	
(C)—The minor's parent or guardian shall not be liable for	28	
the costs of services which are received by a minor under <u>this</u>	29	
division $\overline{(A)}$ .	30	
(D)(B)(1) A mental health professional may provide a	31	
crisis assessment to a minor without the consent or knowledge of	32	
the minor's parent, legal guardian, or custodian if both of the		
<pre>following are the case:</pre>	34	
(a) The mental health professional believes that the minor	35	
may be suicidal or may pose a risk of physical harm to others or	36	
the mental health professional has received credible information		
from an adult supervising the minor that the minor may be		
suicidal or may pose a risk of physical harm to others.		
(b) The minor's parent, legal guardian, or custodian is	40	
not available to provide consent.	41	
(2) As soon as practicable after the crisis assessment,	42	
the mental health professional shall make a good faith effort to	43	
notify the minor's parent, legal guardian, or custodian that the		
assessment was provided.	45	
(C) The director of mental health and addiction services	46	
shall adopt rules identifying the types of mental health		
professionals who are permitted to provide outpatient mental_		

health services under division (A) of this section and crisis	4 9	
assessments under division (B) of this section. The rules shall	50	
be adopted in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code.	51	
(D) Nothing in this section relieves a mental health	52	
professional from the obligations of section 2151.421 of the	53	
Revised Code.	54	
(E) As used in this section, "mental health professional"	55	
has the same meaning as in section 340.02 of the Revised Code.	56	
Sec. 5164.15. (A) As used in this section:	57	
(1), "Community community mental health services provider	58	
or facility" means a community mental health services provider	59	
or facility that has its community mental health services	60	
certified by the department of mental health and addiction	61	
services under section 5119.36 of the Revised Code or by the	62	
department of job and family services under section 5103.03 of	63	
the Revised Code.	64	
(2) "Mental health professional" means a person qualified	65	
to work with mentally ill persons under the standards-	66	
established by the director of mental health and addiction-	67	
services pursuant to section 5119.36 of the Revised Code.	68	
(B) The medicaid program may cover the following mental	69	
health services when provided by community mental health	70	
services providers or facilities:	71	
(1) Outpatient mental health services, including, but not	72	
limited to, preventive, diagnostic, therapeutic, rehabilitative,	73	
and palliative interventions rendered to individuals in an	74	
individual or group setting by a mental health professional in	75	
accordance with a plan of treatment appropriately established,		
monitored, and reviewed;	77	

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(2) Partial-hospitalization mental health services	78	
rendered by persons directly supervised by a mental health		
professional;		
(3) Unscheduled, emergency mental health services of a	81	
kind ordinarily provided to persons in crisis when rendered by	82	
persons supervised by a mental health professional;	83	
(4) Assertive community treatment and intensive home-based	84	
mental health services.	85	
(C) The department of medicaid shall enter into a separate	86	
contract with the department of mental health and addiction	87	
services under section 5162.35 of the Revised Code with regard	88	
to the mental health services the medicaid program covers	89	
pursuant to this section. As part of the terms of the contract,	90	
the departments shall identify the types of mental health	91	
professionals who are permitted to render or supervise the	92	
services.	93	
Section 2. That existing sections 5122.04 and 5164.15 of	94	
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	95	
Section 3. All items in this act are hereby appropriated	96	
as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the	97	
credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations	98	
made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year	99	
2022 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2023.	100	
The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to	101	
any other operating appropriations made for the FY 2022-FY 2023	102	
biennium.
