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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.755 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Little Brown Jug" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.755 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants 8  
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to 9  
sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 10  
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 34  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 35

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 36  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 37  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 38  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 39  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 40  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 41  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 42  
other abortion-related activities. 43

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 44  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 45  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 46  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 47

organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 48  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 49  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 50  
other money in that fund. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 52  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 53  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 54  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 57  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 58  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 59  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 60  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 61  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 62  
directly to their clients. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 65  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 66  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 67  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 70  
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 71  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 72  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 75  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 76

its research and other programs. 77

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 78  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 79  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 80  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 82  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 83  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 84  
contributions for its research and other programs. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 87  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 88  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 89  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 92  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 93  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 94  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 96  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 97  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 98  
contributions into its general account to be used for 99  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 100  
America foundation. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 102  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 103  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 104  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 105

the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.	106
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	107
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio	108
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for	109
scholarships and other educational activities.	110
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	111
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the	112
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those	113
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of	114
that organization.	115
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	116
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to	117
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for	118
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or	119
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.	120
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	121
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the	122
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that	123
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in	124
need.	125
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	126
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a	127
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the	128
Ohio chapters of a kid again.	129
The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar	130
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the	131
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on	132
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that	133
section. A university or college that receives contributions	134

from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 135  
scholarship fund. 136

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 138  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 139  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 140  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 141  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 142  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 143  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 144  
funds as provided in this section. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 146  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 147  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 148  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 149  
cyclists of all ages. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 152  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 153  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 154  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 155  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 156  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 157

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 158  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 159  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 160  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 161  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 163

receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 164  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 165  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 166  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 169  
United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 170  
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 171  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 172  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 173  
sponsors within this state. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 176  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 177  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 178  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 179  
activities. 180

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 181  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 182  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 183  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 184  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 185  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 188  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 189  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 190  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 191  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 192  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 193

research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 194  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 197  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 198  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 199  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 200  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 201  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 204  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 205  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 206  
families. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 208  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 209  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 210  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 211  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 212  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 213  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 214  
destination. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 216  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 217  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 218  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 219  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 220

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 221  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 222

4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 223  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 224  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 225  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 226  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 227  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 228  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 229  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 230  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 231

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 232  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 233  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 236  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 237  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 238  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 239  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 240  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 241  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 242  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 243  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 244  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 245  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 246  
under this section. 247

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 248  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 249  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 250  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 251  
programs. 252

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the

expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 283  
river watershed. 284

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 285  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 286  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 287  
nature preserve. 288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 289  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 290  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 291  
the money in support of the park. 292

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 293  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 294  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 295  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 296

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 297  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 298  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 299  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 301  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 302  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 303  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 304  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 305  
local beekeeping programs. 306

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 307  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 308  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 309  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 310  
legends to inspire future leaders. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, which shall use the contributions for the protection and preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in Ohio and for educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 341  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 342  
supporting cancer research. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 345  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 347  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 348  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 349

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 350  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 351  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 352  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 353  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 354

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 355  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 356  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 357  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 358  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 359  
scouts. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 362  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 363  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 364  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 367  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 368  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement methods, and teaching respect for law and order.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio concerns of police survivors, which shall use those contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater

Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 399  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 400  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 402  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 403  
association of chiefs of police. 404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 406  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 407  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 408  
families. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 411  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 412  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 415  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 416  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 417  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 418  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 419  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 420  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 421  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 422  
participating in that program. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 424  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 425  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 426  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 429  
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 430  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 431  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 434  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 435  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 436  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 437  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 438  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 439  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 440  
lives to the fullest. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 443  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 444  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 445  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 448  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 449  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 450  
Cleveland, Ohio. 451

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 452  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 453  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 454  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 455  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 456  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 457

resides. 458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 459  
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 460  
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 461  
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 462  
law enforcement education and assistance. 463

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 464  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 465  
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 466  
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 467  
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 468  
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 469

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 470  
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 471  
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 472  
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 473  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 474  
rotary foundation. 475

municipal corporation of Cleveland. The school shall use fifty 992  
per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition 993  
assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining 994  
fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing 995  
services to the school's students that assist in developing or 996  
maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. 997  
The services provided may include bereavement counseling, 998  
instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity 999  
training, and the counseling and education of students regarding 1000  
bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and 1001

human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the 1002  
school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to 1003  
receive training in providing those services. The school 1004  
principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate 1005  
school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 1006  
that the school hires to provide those services. The school 1007  
shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt 1008  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 1009  
Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the 1010  
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 1011

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1012  
receives pursuant to section 4503.955 of the Revised Code to 1013  
Saint Albert the Great school located in North Royalton. The 1014  
school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1015  
to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1016  
use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1017  
in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1018  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1019  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1020  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1021  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1022  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1023  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1024  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1025  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1026  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1027  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1028  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1029  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1030  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1031  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1032

shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1033  
purpose. 1034

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1035  
receives pursuant to section 4503.956 of the Revised Code to the 1036  
Liberty Center local school district, which shall use the 1037  
contributions for its gifted programs and special education and 1038  
related services. 1039

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1040  
receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1041  
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1042  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1043  
purpose. 1044

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1045  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1046  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1047  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1048  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1049  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1050  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1051  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1052

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1053  
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1054  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1055  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1056  
contributions for any political purpose. 1057

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1058  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1059  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1060  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1061

any political purpose. 1062

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1063  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1064  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1065  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1066  
purpose. 1067

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1068  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1069  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1070  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1071  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1072

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1073  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1074  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1075  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1076  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1077

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1078  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1079  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1080  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1081  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1082  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1083  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1084  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1085

Sec. 4503.755. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1086  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1087  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1088  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1089  
and issuance of "Little Brown Jug" license plates. The 1090

application may be combined with a request for a special 1091  
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1092  
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1093  
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1094  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1095  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Little Brown Jug" 1096  
license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker 1097  
alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1098

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1099  
inscribed on the license plates, "Little Brown Jug" license 1100  
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are 1101  
selected by representatives of the little brown jug society and 1102  
approved by the registrar. "Little Brown Jug" license plates 1103  
shall display county identification stickers that identify the 1104  
county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the 1105  
Revised Code. 1106

(B) "Little Brown Jug" license plates and a validation 1107  
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1108  
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1109  
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1110  
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1111  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1112  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1113  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1114  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1115  
provided in division (C) (1) of this section; and compliance with 1116  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1117  
vehicles. 1118

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1119  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1120

section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty 1121  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1122  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1123  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1124

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1125  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1126  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1127  
of "Little Brown Jug" license plates, into the state treasury to 1128  
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created 1129  
in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1130

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1131  
Code is hereby repealed. 1132
