To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.755 of the Revised Code to create the	2
"Little Brown Jug" license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.755 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	8
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	9

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar44receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the45organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall46deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that47

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organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend48the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same49manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends50other money in that fund.51

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar74receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the75St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for76

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its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar78receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to79special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions80for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.81

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 82 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 83 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 84 contributions for its research and other programs. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86 receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 87 the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 88 raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 89 pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 92 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 93 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 94 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 96 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 97 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 98 contributions into its general account to be used for 99 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 100 America foundation. 101

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar102receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the1034-H youth development program of the Ohio state university104extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay105

the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.	106
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	107

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar	130

receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 131 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 132 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 133 section. A university or college that receives contributions 134

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from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 135 scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 137 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 138 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 139 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 140 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 141 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 142 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 143 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 144 funds as provided in this section. 145

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio cyclists of all ages.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 152 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 153 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 154 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 155 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 156 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 157

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar158receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the159fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for160the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the161lighthouses of fairport harbor.162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 164 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 165 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 166 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 169 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 170 four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 171 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 172 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 173 sponsors within this state. 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 181 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 182 Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 183 under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 184 its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 185 to children, young adults, and families in this state. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 188 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 189 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 190 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 191 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 192 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 193

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research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 194 the improvement of patient outcomes. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 197 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 198 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 199 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 200 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 201 personnel, veterans, and their families. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 204 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 205 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 206 families. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 208 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 209 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 210 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 211 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 212 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 213 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 214 destination. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 216 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 217 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 218 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 219 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 220

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the221contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section222

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4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 223 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 224 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 225 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 226 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 227 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 228 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 229 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 230 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 231

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar232receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the233rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 236 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 237 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 238 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 239 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 240 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 241 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 242 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 243 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 244 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 245 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 246 under this section. 247

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 248 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 249 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 250 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 251 programs. 252

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar253receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the254western reserve historical society, which shall use the255contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.256

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar257receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the258Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple259negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the260contributions for charitable and educational purposes.261

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar262receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the263central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities,264which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the265Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory266the person who paid the contribution resides.267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 269 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 270 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 271 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 272 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 273 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 274 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 275 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 276 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 277 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 278 such payments are to be made. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar280receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the281Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the282

expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 285 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 286 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 287 nature preserve. 288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 289 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 290 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 291 the money in support of the park. 292

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar293receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the294Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the295contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.296

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar297receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the298girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the299contributions to support the activities of the organization.300

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 301 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 302 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 303 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 304 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 305 local beekeeping programs. 306

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 307 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 308 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 309 contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 310 legends to inspire future leaders. 311

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 312 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 313 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 314 the contributions for educational purposes. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar316receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the317Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the318contributions to support the activities of the organization.319

320 The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 321 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 322 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 323 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 324 commission and that is participating in the license plate 325 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 326 of the county of residence of an applicant. 327

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each328contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of329the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates330that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is331participating in the license plate program pursuant to division332(G) of that section.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 335 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 336 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 337 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 338 Ohio and for educational programs. 339

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 341 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 342 supporting cancer research. 343

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 345 Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar347receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the348Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.349

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar350receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the351Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council352shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner353throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.354

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 355 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 356 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 357 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 358 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 359 scouts. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar361receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the362Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council363shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner364throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 367 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 368 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar370receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the371Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,372which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 375 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 376 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 377 charitable purposes. 378

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 379 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 380 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 381 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 382 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 385 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 386 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 387 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 388 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 389 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 391 pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 392 concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 393 contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 394 to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 395 in the line of duty. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions received397pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater398

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Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 399 contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 400 the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of chiefs of police.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar405receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the406fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions407to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their408families.409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 415 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 416 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 417 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 418 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 419 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 420 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 421 children, and for the training and supervision of persons 422 423 participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar424receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the425Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the426contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.427

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar428receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the429Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,430which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and431advocacy purposes throughout the state.432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 434 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 435 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 436 437 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 438 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 439 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 440 lives to the fullest. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar442receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to443Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the444contributions into its general account to be used for purposes445of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar447receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the448Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to449commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in450Cleveland, Ohio.451

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar452receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the453central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research454foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the455chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose456geographic territory the person who paid the contribution457

resides.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar459receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the460Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the461contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting462law enforcement education and assistance.463

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 464 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 465 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 466 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 467 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 468 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 469

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar470receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the471rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,472Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and473used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the474rotary foundation.475

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar476receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the477Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the478contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained479under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation.480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar481receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to482buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the483contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar485receives pursuant to section 4503.754 of the Revised Code to the486

municipal corporation of Twinsburg.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar488receives pursuant to section 4503.755 of the Revised Code to the489little brown jug society to assist the society in maintaining,490promulgating, and operating the little brown jug as part of491Ohio's rich harness racing history.492

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 493 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 494 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 495 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 496 connection. 497

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1040 receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1041 John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1042 shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1043 purpose. 1044

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1045 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1046 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1047 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1048 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1049 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1050 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1051 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1052

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1053receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1054Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1055corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1056contributions for any political purpose.1057

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1058receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1059Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1060Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1061

any political purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1063receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1064Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1065high school shall not use the contributions for any political1066purpose.1067

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1068receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1069friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1070to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1071emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1072

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1073receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1074Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1075activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the1076city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."1077

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1078 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1079 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1080 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1081 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1082 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1083 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1084 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1085
