To enact section 5525.26 of the Revised Code to	1

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5525.26 of the Revised Code be	6
enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 5525.26. (A) The director of transportation shall	8
adopt rules in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code	9
that do all of the following:	10
(1) Encourage competition among industries involved in the	11
production of paving materials so that monopoly situations are	12
avoided and no single type of highway pavement receives	13
preferential treatment in the highway construction project	14
bidding process;	15
(2) Prohibit the adoption of any requirements or	16
guidelines that favor a single type of highway pavement in the	17
highway construction project bidding process;	18

(3) Comply with federal highway administration guidelines	19
and recommendations for pavement design, use of alternate	20
bidding for pavement type selection, and the promotion of	21
competition in highway construction project bidding.	22
(B) The director shall ensure that the rules required by	23
division (A) of this section are effective not later than	24
January 1, 2022.	25
(C) Upon the effective date of the rules required by	26
division (A) of this section, the director shall deliver a copy	27
of the rules to the speaker of the house of representatives, the	28
president of the senate, and the chairs of the standing	29
committees in the house of representatives and senate with	30
primary responsibility over transportation issues.	31
(D) The rules required by division (A) of this section	32
shall apply, after their effective date, to all highway	33
construction projects that are advertised for bids pursuant to	34
this chapter.	35
