| (1) "Disability" has the same meaning as in section | 11 |

homosexuality, or bisexuality. 18 (4) "Peace officer" has the same meaning as in section 19 2921.51 of the Revised Code. 20 (5) "Law enforcement agency" means a government entity 21 that employs peace officers to perform law enforcement duties. 22 (B) No person shall violate section 2903.12, 2903.13, 23 2903.21, 2903.22, 2905.01, 2905.02, 2905.03, 2909.02, 2909.03, 24 2909.05, 2909.06, or 2909.07, or division (A) of section 25 2903.11, or division (A)(3), (4), or (5) of section 2917.21 of 26 the Revised Code-by reason, and intentionally select the person 27 against whom the offender commits the violation or the property 28 that is damaged or otherwise affected by the violation, in whole 29 or in part because of the actual or perceived race, color, 30 religion, orethnicity, national origin, gender, sexual 31 orientation, gender identity, or disability of another the other 32 person or group of persons, whether or not the offender's belief 33 or perception was correct. 34 (B)-(C) Whoever violates this section is quilty of ethnic 35 intimidationbias-motivated crime. Ethnic intimidation Bias-36 motivated crime is an offense of the next higher degree than the 37 offense the commission of which is a necessary element of ethnic-38 intimidationbias-motivated crime. 39 (D) (1) The attorney general shall provide training for all 40 peace officers in identifying, responding to, and reporting 41 bias-motivated crime. 42 (2) The attorney general shall adopt, in accordance with 43 Chapter 119. or pursuant to section 109.74 of the Revised Code, 44 rules governing the training of peace officers in identifying, 45
