To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.517 of the Revised Code to create the "On	2
Our Sleeves" license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.517 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22 receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23 organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24 deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25 organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26 the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27 manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28 other money in that fund. 29 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34

receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40 directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with45pancreatic cancer and their families.46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77

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educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78 America foundation. 79 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84 85 The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88 The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 97 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the100organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that101organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in102need.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar104receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a105kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the106

Ohio chapters of a kid again.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 108 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 109 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 110 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 111 section. A university or college that receives contributions 112 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 113 scholarship fund. 114

115 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 116 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 117 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 118 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 119 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 120 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 121 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 122 funds as provided in this section. 123

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 124 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 125 Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 126 contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 127

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 128 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 129 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 130 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 131 cyclists of all ages. 132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 133 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 134 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 135

incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 136
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 137
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 138
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 139

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar140receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the141fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for142the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the143lighthouses of fairport harbor.144

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 145 receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 146 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 147 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 148 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 151 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twentyfour, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 153 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 154 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 155 sponsors within this state. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 158 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 159 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 160 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 161 activities. 162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar163receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the164

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Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives165under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing166its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services167to children, young adults, and families in this state.168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 170 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 171 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 172 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 173 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 174 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 175 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 176 the improvement of patient outcomes. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 179 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 180 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 181 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 182 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 183 personnel, veterans, and their families. 184

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 185 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 186 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 187 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 188 families. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 191 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 192 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 193 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 194 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose195of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel196destination.197

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 198 the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 199 to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 200 the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 201 programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 202

203 The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 204 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 205 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 206 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 207 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 208 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 209 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 210 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 211 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 212 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar214receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the215rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.216

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 217 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 218 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 219 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 220 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 221 222 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 223 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 224

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Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay225for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and226promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs227incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received228under this section.229

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 230 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 231 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 232 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 233 programs. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar235receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the236western reserve historical society, which shall use the237contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.238

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 239 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 240 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 241 negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 242 contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 243

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 244 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 245 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 246 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 247 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 248 the person who paid the contribution resides. 249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar250receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the251state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall252deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it253

establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 254 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 255 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 256 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 257 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 2.58 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 259 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 260 261 such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar275receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the276Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the277contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.278

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar279receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the280girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the281contributions to support the activities of the organization.282

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 283 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 284 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 285 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 286 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 287 local beekeeping programs. 288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar289receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the290national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the291contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace292legends to inspire future leaders.293

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 302 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 303 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 304 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 305 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 306 commission and that is participating in the license plate 307 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 308 of the county of residence of an applicant. 309

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each310contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of311

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the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates312that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is313participating in the license plate program pursuant to division314(G) of that section.315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 317 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 318 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 319 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 320 Ohio and for educational programs. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar322receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to323pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of324supporting cancer research.325

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar332receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the333Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council334shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner335throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.336

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar337receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the338girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's339heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable340

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manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 341
scouts. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar343receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the344Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council345shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner346throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 349 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 350 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar352receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the353Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,354which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 356 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 357 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 358 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 359 charitable purposes. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361 receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 362 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 363 deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 364 purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar366receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the367fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall368deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be369

used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law	370
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement	371
methods, and teaching respect for law and order.	372
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	373
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio	374
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those	375

The registrar shall pay the contributions received	379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 396 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 397 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 398

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association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under399Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association400shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in401administering a program to secure the proper representation in402the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent403children, and for the training and supervision of persons404participating in that program.405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar406receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the407Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the408contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar410receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the411Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,412which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and413advocacy purposes throughout the state.414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their lives to the fullest.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar424receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to425Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the426contributions into its general account to be used for purposes427of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.428

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar429receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the430Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to431commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in432Cleveland, Ohio.433

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting law enforcement education and assistance.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 446 receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 447 Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 448 moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 449 4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 450 agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 451

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar452receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the453rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston,454Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and455used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the456rotary foundation.457

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those contributions solely to promote and support the historical preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 501 receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the 502 Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those 503 contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth 504 baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City. 505

506 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 507 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 508 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 509 providing services to the school district's students that assist 510 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 511 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 512 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 513 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 514 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 515 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school district 516

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superintendent or, in the school district superintendent's 517 discretion, the appropriate school principal or appropriate 518 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 519 that the school district hires to provide those services. The 520 school district also may use the contributions it receives to 521 pay for members of the faculty of the school district to receive 522 training in providing such services to the students of the 523 school district. The school district shall ensure that any 524 charitable organization that is hired by the district is exempt 525 from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 526 Internal Revenue Code. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1063 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1064 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1065 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1066 and issuance of "On Our Sleeves" license plates. The application 1067 may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 1068 plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1069 receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1070 applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1071 registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 1072 registration and a set of "On Our Sleeves" license plates and a 1073 validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1074 by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1075 In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1076 inscribed on the license plates, "On Our Sleeves" license plates 1077 shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by 1078 representatives of Nationwide children's hospital and approved 1079 by the registrar. "On Our Sleeves" license plates shall display 1080 county identification stickers that identify the county of 1081 registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1082

(B) "On Our Sleeves" license plates and a validation 1084 sticker, or validation_sticker alone, shall be issued upon_ 1085 receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1086 under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1087 prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1088 applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1089 of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1090 section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1091

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administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as	1092
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with	1093
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor	1094
vehicles.	1095
(C)(1) For each application for registration and	1096
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this	1097
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty	1098
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the	1099
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution	1100
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code.	1101
(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of	1102
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of	1103
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing	1104
of "On Our Sleeves" license plates, into the state treasury to	1105
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created	1106
