BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 505.60 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read as follows:	6
Sec. 505.60. (A) As provided in this section and section	7
505.601 of the Revised Code, the board of township trustees of	8
any township may procure and pay all or any part of the cost of	9
insurance policies that may provide benefits for	10
hospitalization, surgical care, major medical care, disability,	11
dental care, eye care, medical care, hearing aids, prescription	12
drugs, or sickness and accident insurance, or a combination of	13
any of the foregoing types of insurance for township officers	14
and employees. The board of township trustees of any township	15
may negotiate and contract for the purchase of a policy of long-	16
term care insurance for township officers and employees pursuant	17
to section 124.841 of the Revised Code.	18
If the board procures any insurance policies under this	19

section, the board shall provide uniform coverage under these	20
policies for township officers and full-time township employees	21
and their immediate dependents, and may provide coverage under	22
these policies for part-time township employees and their	23
immediate dependents, from the funds or budgets from which the	24
officers or employees are compensated for services, such	25
policies to be issued by an insurance company duly authorized to	26
do business in this state.	27

- (B) The board may also provide coverage for any or all of 28 the benefits described in division (A) of this section by 29 entering into a contract for group health care services with 30 health insuring corporations holding certificates of authority 31 under Chapter 1751. of the Revised Code for township officers 32 and employees and their immediate dependents. If the board so 33 contracts, it shall provide uniform coverage under any such 34 contracts for township officers and full-time township employees 3.5 and their immediate dependents, from the funds or budgets from 36 which the officers or employees are compensated for services, 37 and may provide coverage under such contracts for part-time 38 township employees and their immediate dependents, from the 39 funds or budgets from which the officers or employees are 40 compensated for services, provided that each officer and 41 employee so covered is permitted to: 42
- (1) Choose between a plan offered by an insurance company and a plan offered by a health insuring corporation, and provided further that the officer or employee pays any amount by which the cost of the plan chosen exceeds the cost of the plan offered by the board under this section;

(2) Change the choice made under this division at a time 48 each year as determined in advance by the board. 49

An addition of a class or change of definition of coverage
to the plan offered under this division by the board may be made
at any time that it is determined by the board to be in the best
interest of the township. If the total cost to the township of
the revised plan for any trustee's coverage does not exceed that
cost under the plan in effect during the prior policy year, the
revision of the plan does not cause an increase in that
trustee's compensation.

- (C) Any township officer or employee may refuse to accept any coverage authorized by this section without affecting the availability of such coverage to other township officers and employees.
- (D) If any township officer or employee is denied coverage under a health care plan procured under this section or if any township officer or employee elects not to participate in the township's health care plan, the township may reimburse the officer or employee for each out-of-pocket premium attributable to the coverage provided for the officer or employee and their immediate dependents for insurance benefits described in division (A) of this section that the officer or employee otherwise obtains, but not to exceed an amount equal to the average premium paid by the township for its officers and employees under any health care plan it procures under this section.
- (E) The board may provide the benefits authorized under this section, without competitive bidding, by contributing to a health and welfare trust fund administered through or in conjunction with a collective bargaining representative of the township employees.

section through an individual self-insurance program or a joint	80

(F) If a board of township trustees fails to pay one or	83
more premiums for a policy, contract, or plan of insurance or	84
health care services authorized under this section and the	85
failure causes a lapse, cancellation, or other termination of	86
coverage under the policy, contract, or plan, it may reimburse a	87
township officer or employee for, or pay on behalf of the	88
officer or employee, any expenses incurred that would have been	89
covered under the policy, contract, or plan.	90
(G) As used in this section and section 505.601 of the	91
Revised Code:	92
(1) "Applicable large employer" has the same meaning as in	93
section 1513 of the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care	94
Act," 26 U.S.C. 4980H.	95
(2) "Part-time township employee" means aeither of the	96

(a) A township employee who is employed by a township that	98
does not qualify as an applicable large employer and who is	99
hired with the expectation that the employee will work not more	100
than one thousand five nine hundred seventy-six hours in any	101
year <u>;</u>	102
(b) A township employee who is employed by a township that	103
qualifies as an applicable large employer and who is hired with	104
the expectation that the employee will work less than one	105
thousand five hundred sixty hours in any year.	106
(2)(3) "Premium" does not include any deductible or health	107
care costs paid directly by a township officer or employee.	108

Section 2. That existing section 505.60 of the Revised	109	
Code is hereby repealed.	110	
Section 3. This act applies to a collective bargaining	111	
agreement entered into under Chapter 4117. of the Revised Code	112	
on or after the effective date of this section.	113	
Section 4. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency	114	
measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public	115	
peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is to	116	
ensure that townships can maintain adequate staffing with part-	117	
time employees. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate	118	
effect.	119
