Hi, I am Lexi Rittenhouse from Clark County. I am a 5th grader at Northwestern Elementary School. I am also a 3rd year 4H'r. On my family farm we raise cattle, goats, chickens, turkeys and ducks. We sell the eggs, and we also raise and sell broilers and turkeys.

4H means a lot to me and my family. The motto of 4H is "To Make the Best Better' and I believe it does just that! It teaches us a lot. Our livestock projects teach us hard work, dedication, responsibility and respect. Raising our projects and preparing for the fair takes a lot of work, but it makes us better people.

Unfortunately, not everyone has the facilities to raise a calf, goat, hog or sheep. So, poultry projects are more suitable for those situations. But 6 turkeys cost twice as much to raise at 3 turkeys do. Feed costs have gone way up over the last few years, as have most things. So by allowing kids to purchase and raise 3 poultry projects as opposed to 6 makes it a much more profitable project.

I agree with the minimum of 3 birds because birds of a feather flock together and they like to have at least 1 buddy. Birds do better when there is more than one.
