My name is Chuck Sayers, I am the Commander of Howland American Legion Post 700. I would like to thank you for allowing me, on behalf of our membership, to submit our support for Senate Bill 160. The Howland American Legion is composed of hard working, proud veterans who are constantly seeking ways to help other veterans in need and this legislation is an excellent tool for that mission.

Although some American Legion members may not have seen conflict or war that; however, that does not mean they have not been exposed to dangers that create illness later in life. One example of this is service men and woman who were stationed at Camp Lejeune between 1953 - 1987 and later developed cancer or other chronic illness caused by contaminated water sources at the base.
