

SB 25 Proponent Testimony

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Chairman LaRe, Vice-Chairman Swearingen and Ranking Member Leland:

On behalf of the Construction Employers Association (CEA), I would like to thank you for the opportunity to provide written proponent testimony on SB 25. Although we support both issues contained in SB 25, I am only going to address the provisions regarding synthetic urine.

CEA is a nonprofit trade association with over 175 contractor members and represents employers of approximately 8,000 skilled trades and construction management personnel primarily in Northeast Ohio. Our members range from large general contractors to small subcontractors. We are committed to construction safety by offering our members various programs to increase safety at their job sites.

Construction work can be dangerous, stressful and physically demanding. Each person working on a construction site depends on the skill level, competence and fitness for duty of those of their co-workers. They have to rely on one another to safely do their jobs in order to protect themselves and their fellow workers from accidents.

Provisions contained in SB 25 prohibit defrauding a drug or urine screening test and bans the sale and use of fake urine for that screening. Synthetic urine is easily accessible. An internet search shows the number of brands and locations where you can purchase various products to help pass drug tests. Those who choose to use these products are not only putting their lives at risk but the lives of their co-workers. Ohio employers should not have to worry about the validity of drug test results because someone may have used synthetic urine to pass a drug test.

CEA would like to thank Senator Gavarone for introducing this important piece of legislation. The synthetic urine language in SB 25 is a common sense approach to help increase workplace safety. Ohio should join the other 18 states that have already enacted laws similar to this bill to address this growing problem.

Thank you again for the opportunity to submit this testimony and we urge the committee to favorably pass SB 25.
