She forgot her name, age, how to cook, how to use the restroom etc. For years she thought she was age 16, and thought I was her best friend at the time. One day she woke up and just forgot about it, Forgot who she was, who I was, etc. By late 60's she couldn't speak anymore, she couldn't walk, or even feed herself. My heart broke. It was just like that movie Benjamin Button. She was now in an infant like state. Unable to speak, talk, feed herself or change herself. Just as an infant would cry if something was wrong, this was now what my mother doing.

When her abuse started, she would cry when we would leave. We didn't figure out why for months down the road when we caught the abuse on tape. We would have Never known about the abuse she faced without the camera's being there. We need to protect our elderly. As one day, we may be in their shoes.
