Without the option to medically transition I don't believe many of my trans loved ones would still be here today. It is absurd to deny this harmless community of people their basic medical needs. I am truly disgusted by the actions being taken to limit our communities rights. Trans individuals have an exponentially higher rate of suicide than the majority of the population and it will rise if we add to their pain. If this legislation is allowed to pass lives WILL be lost and those who allow it will have blood on their hands.
