Dear Chairwoman Manchester, Vice Chair Cutrona and Ranking Member Denson,

I am writing because I strongly oppose HB 454. As the parent of a LGBTQ child, I know how difficult life is for these children. For some everyday is a struggle, both mentally and physically. I truly don't understand why you want to add to this struggle by regulating a medical decision that should be between the child, parents, and the physician. By passing this bill I strongly believe we will lose more of our LGBTQ youth to self-harm, drug7 addiction, or worse suicide.

Just some general information.

*LGBTQ youth are 4 times as likely than their peers to commit suicide.

*LGBTQ youth are not more prone to suicide because of their sexual orientation or gender identity but because of mistreatment of society.

*Trans and non-binary youth at 2.5 times as likely to experience depressive symptoms, consider suicide and attempt suicide. These rates are even higher for youth of color.

*73% of LGBTQ youth report discrimination or being bullied.

*The standard of care for trans children states that no puberty blockers will be given until puberty has begun (not before) and nor surgeries until after 18 years old.

Lastly, I would like to remember Leelah Alcorn. She was an Ohio youth that took her own life because of the trauma she faced. She wanted her death to mean something and I believe she started the conversation and we should continue that by supporting our trans youth not hurting them.

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
