Chairman Lipps, Vice Chair Holmes, Ranking Member Russo, and members of the House Health Committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify today in support of HB 135.

Many patient groups, including the American Heart Association, throughout Ohio have appreciated the efforts to address the ongoing, discriminatory nature of accumulator co-payment adjustment programs in health insurance policies. We believe House Bill 135, sponsored by Reps. Susan Manchester and Thomas West is an important tool in leading the crucial debate on ensuring that all financial assistance provided to patients to meet their ever-growing out-of-pocket costs is addressed.

As we are all aware, Ohioans and many throughout the world are still experiencing numerous hardships as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic crisis.
