Chairman Lipps, Vice Chair Holmes, Ranking Member Russo, and Members of the House Health Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide proponent testimony on House Bill 248.

My name is Jennifer Drabik and I am a wife, mother, and healthcare provider of 20 years and I support House Bill 248. I lost my job in 2012 because of a mandatory flu shot, so I am very familiar with how vaccine mandates negatively impact a person's livelihood and freedom to choose how to care for their personal health.

It has become increasingly evident how important HB248 is in Ohio. Vaccines are not a one size fits all. There are Ohioans who cannot receive vaccines for medical or religious reasons.
