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Dear Chairman Lipps, Vice Chair Holmes, Ranking Member Russo and Members of the House Health Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide proponent testimony on House Bill 248.

My name is Katherine Nigro and I am a small business owner and a mom of three. The reason I support House Bill 248 is because I believe that medical freedom is of utmost importance. I am a previous pharmaceutical employee with a Biology/Chemistry degree and my past career involved analyzing and interpreting clinical studies. After reviewing a large amount of clinical studies pertaining to the various Covid Vaccines and the Covid-19 disease state, I firmly believe that there is not enough long term data for me to feel comfortable getting a Covid vaccine or vaccinating my children. In addition, there are many red flags within the clinical studies that highlight the inadequacy of the studies to find true, valid efficacy results.
