Chairman Lipps, Vice-Chair Holmes, Ranking Member Russo, and members of the House Health Committee, my name is Li Lin and I am here to testify in opposition to H.B. No 248

As a medical student at The Ohio State University, I am passionate about the health and wellbeing of my future patients. An invaluable component of our current way of life is widespread community vaccinations. The World Health Organization estimates that every year, 4-5 million deaths are prevented through vaccination.

Since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic, more than 600,000 Americans have died from this virus. Through the decades of research on coronavirus vaccines and the federal government's work to expedite the bureaucracies of vaccine approval, we now have several safe vaccines that are 95% effective at preventing serious disease and death. The only way now to stop the pandemic is to encourage vaccinations and reach herd immunity. Only through increased vaccinations can we protect the ones we love and the most vulnerable members of our society who cannot receive vaccines.

As a medical student, I am learning how to provide the most excellent care to my patients through compassion and education.
