Chairman Lipps, Vice Chair Holmes, Ranking Member Russo and Members of the House Health Committee, thank-you for the opportunity to provide proponent testimony on House Bill 248

My name is Barbara Schwendenmann and I am a registered pharmacist currently working full time in the state of Ohio and the reason I support House bill 248 is because I do not believe the vaccinations are safe. When a vaccination was introduced for emergency use for the "swine flu" was halted after a mere 450 cases of Guillain Barre occurred. I have seen many more cases of adverse events with the available COVID spike protein injections. This should sound an alarm in the medical world. I am concerned that the public are not fully given the ability to give informed consent and the cases of death and severe adverse reactions to the "vaccines" available are not readily available to the public.

I am also concerned that about the classification of this current situation as a pandemic since we have not had an increase in the number of deaths in the United States from the average number of deaths of previous year pre 2020.

We are still in the experimental phase of these vaccines and we do not yet know the long term effects that they will have on those receiving them.
