Chairman Lipps, Vice Chair Holmes, Ranking Member Russo, and Members of the House Health Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide proponent testimony on House Bill 248.

I am deeply concerned by what I see happening in other states in our country. Governments are encouraging or sitting by idly as businesses, colleges, and institutions are mandating a vaccine to the detriment of their constituents. Such policy is unfathomable in a country that was founded on civil liberties and basic human rights. With such a fundamental civil liberty as medical freedom now on the line, Ohioans absolutely must be heard and taken into the highest consideration in creating policy regarding this matter. I support HB 248 wholeheartedly in order to protect every Ohioan's fundamental right to choose, without coercion or repercussion, whether they accept a vaccine be injected into their body. Also, no person should be discriminated against or have limited mobility in society due to their personal choice to decline a vaccine. Many Ohioans are under extreme duress without a law in place that will prohibit any such vaccine mandates and vaccine passports, and understandably will seek residence in other states that do provide these protections.
