Chairman Lipps, Vice Chair Holmes, Ranking Member Russo and Members of the Health Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide proponent testimony on House Bill 248.

My name is Matthew Niemer and I am a firefighter/paramedic. The reasons I support HB248 are:

- 1. Medical Freedom, my medical decisions should be based on what I want based on my personal beliefs and research. Not on what my employer feels I should have.
- 2. Overreach of government into private lives of citizens. The government can offer things and research but in the end unless we live in a communistic society force of medical procedures should be illegal.
- 3.
