

Sponsor Testimony - House Bill 299 – Consumer Utility Billing Transparency Act By Representative Michael J. Skindell Before the House Public Utilities Committee May 19, 2021

Chairman Hoops, Vice Chairman Ray, Ranking Member Smith, and Members of the House Public Utilities Committee, I appreciate the opportunity to provide sponsor testimony on House Bill 299, called the "Consumer Utility Billing Transparency Act".

The proposed legislation would enact Section 4933.30 of the Ohio Revised Code and require electric, natural gas and water utilities to provide itemized billing statements to customers. Distribution, transmission, generation, and supply charges must be itemized on customer bills as well as taxes and riders.

Knowing what is contained in the charges of a utility bill may help consumers save money. An itemized utility bill will also help customers check for errors and monitor their particular utility usage. In Ohio, basic charges such as distribution and transmission costs are itemized on customer bills, but a large number of riders are lumped in with distribution charges. In 2014, the General Assembly adopted Senate Bill 310, which required the disclosure to customers of the costs of the energy efficiency requirements, but it did not require a disclosure of the various riders. There are many riders and they are different for each utility. House Bill 299 will help consumers decipher their utility bills.
