## Written Proponent Testimony for House Bill 450 Public Utilities Committee

Chairman Hoops and members of the Public Utilities Committee, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony in support of House Bill 450. House Bill 450 seeks to provide cost effective solar for all Ohioans who want it.

GEM Energy is part of the Rudolph Libbe Group which employs over 1,500 fellow Ohioans. We focus on building solar projects and other forms of advanced energy. The projects we build provide commercial and industrial customers here in Ohio some of the most cost effective forms of power on the market today.
