## Testimony of Shirley Fleet Train in support of HJR No.1

Chairman Wiggam, Vice Chairman St. John, Ranking Member Kelly, and members of the State and Local Government Committee,

I am a retired teacher from Toledo, Ohio; my husband and I chose to retire in Bellbrook, Ohio in 2007. I grew up in Tenafly, New Jersey where my parents' choices to serve their community were wonderful role models for me. My father, Clifton Fleet, served as a volunteer fireman for nine years and as mayor for four years. I'm sure that my interest in government was a result of many candlelight dinner table discussions.
