We are a divided nation. Polarized to be precise. We agree on very little. Taxation . . . Women's Rights . . . Civil Rights . . . COVID – does it exist – much less how to scientifically manage and treat it . . . many challenge the separation of church and state . . . January 6 . . . dark money . . . there are even some among us that think Vladamir Putin is a "good guy!" The vitriol and lack of respect demonstrated by our leaders is abhorrent. Our representatives are required to vote along party lines otherwise they will receive a censure from their state party. Our leaders attempt to sway state election officials.
