## The Ohio House Transportation and Public Safety Committee RE: House Bill 392- Authorize ambulance transport of a police dog injured in the line of duty Proponent Testimony

We spend significant time and money training our police dogs, therefore it is critical to have accessible and quick transportation should an emergency situation occur on duty.
