SB52 is bad legislation in so many ways. It undermines the existing due process that is mandated by current law. The Ohio Power Siting Board must include public hearings for local residents during the certification application, a process that has served long and well the energy needs of Ohio. SB52 caters to a vocal minority at the expense of individual land owners and the citizens at large who favor clean renewable energy. Why is the legislature proposing to single out these two forms of energy generation for stricter review while fossil generated producers are given a free pass?
