LOCAL AND STATE GOVERNMENT

This Bill is an outrage. It takes away some half decent protections of public land and virtually mandates the exploitation of state land, including state parks and state forests to be on standby for the use of the oil and gas industry. These state parks and forests are sanctuaries that people need to walk through in order to connect with nature and restore their mind and body. Turn the tables on the House by also showing you can protect Old Growth Woods at Malabar Farm State Park.
