As a taxpayer, property owner and concerned citizen of Ohio, please accept this statement in support of Senate Bill 61. As homeowners across the state are beginning to realize the substantial amounts of money they can save when they control their own energy through the installation of solar panels, many Ohioans such as myself are unable to access this form to benefit from this due to outdated restrictive covenants in our homeowner association covenants and guidelines. Proposed Bill 61 would rectify this situation by prohibiting homeowners' associations from unreasonably preventing homeowners from installing solar panels.

For me and many of my fellow homeowners, solar panels represent energy freedom – the choice and ability to choose how and where we get our energy.
