## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, A strong, secure border benefits both the United	3
States and Mexico; and	4
WHEREAS, The well-being and safety of the citizens of the	5
United States and Mexico are being jeopardized by the insecure	6
nature of their shared border; and	7
WHEREAS, The United States government continuously fails to	8
secure its southern border in a manner that is permanent and	9
sustainable; and	10
WHEREAS, It is integral to the security, well-being, and	11
harmony of the people of the United States to sustain a secure	12
southern border; and	13
WHEREAS, The dedicated individuals of the United States	14
Customs and Border Protection work diligently and honorably to	15
secure the southern border in the most efficient and humane	16

manner; and	17	
WHEREAS, Ill-motivated individuals continuously seek to	18	
cause harm, danger, injury, hazard, and peril to those who	19	
protect the United States' borders; and	20	
WHEREAS, Those individuals who cross the United States'	21	
southern border without regard for the legal immigration process	22	
circumvent the individuals who show respect for the rule of law;	23	
and	24	
WHEREAS, Those same individuals defy the right of the	25	
United States to control its own sovereign territory and	26	
regulate the happenings within its rightful borders; and	27	
WHEREAS, The smuggling of contraband, such as drugs and	28	
weapons, as well as human trafficking, have plagued the United	29	
States' southern border; and	30	
WHEREAS, In fiscal year 2019, United States Customs and	31	
Border Protection seized more than 289,000 pounds of marijuana,	32	
89,000 pounds of cocaine, 5,400 pounds of heroin, and 68,000		
pounds of methamphetamine; and	34	
WHEREAS, These illegal drugs are sold, spread, and used	35	
throughout the American citizenry as drug overdoses and abuse	36	
rates reach the highest levels on record in the United States;	37	
and	38	
WHEREAS, In order to curb the spread of COVID-19 and end	39	
the COVID-19 pandemic as soon as possible, the United States'	40	
southern border has been closed to all non-essential travel, a	41	
safety measure that is violated by illegal border crossings; and	42	
WHEREAS, Without the federal government's strict and	43	
decisive action against these dangerous threats, the criminal	44	
element will be willing and able to further exploit the	45	
opportunity to enter and harm the United States, and the COVID-	46
