BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, Ohio currently has eight primary interstate	4
highways running through it that provide easy access to the	5
interstate system for most Ohioans. However, it is imperative	6
that Ohio improve mobility and connectivity for goods, services,	7
and Ohio's workforce to all regions of the state; and	8
WHEREAS, The Federal Highway Administration has plans to	9
connect the south central portion of Ohio to the Interstate	10
Highway System via the extension of Interstate 73 and Interstate	11
74 (I-73 and I-74); and	12
WHEREAS, To complete the extension of I-73 in Ohio, U.S.	13
Route 52 between Huntington, West Virginia and Portsmouth, Ohio	14
will be upgraded, and U.S. Route 23 through Columbus to I-75	15
near Findlay will be upgraded; and	16
WHEREAS, I-74 is proposed to be extended from Cincinnati to	17
Portsmouth, and several routes are being studied as the most	18
suitable to accommodate this extension; and	19
