A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge the United States Congress not to adopt H.R. 1 of the 1 117th Congress.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, House Resolution 1, a sweeping federal bill that	3
would usurp the power of states to conduct elections as they see	4
fit, against the intentions of our nation's founders, is	5
currently under consideration by Congress; and	6
WHEREAS, Article I, section 4 of the United States	7
Constitution grants the legislative branch of each state the	8
authority to prescribe the "Times, Places and Manner of holding	9
Elections for Senators and Representatives," an authority the	10
United States Congress should only supersede in "extraordinary	11
circumstances" according to Alexander Hamilton in Federalist	12
Number 59; and	13
WHEREAS, Voting laws have evolved across the 50 states over	14

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time, providing more and more access, security, and accuracy.	15
But most importantly, each of those same 50 states have created	16
their own unique election systems. From who administers the	17
elections, to how votes are cast, to how a vote is protected -	18
each unique system was born of federalism; and	19

WHEREAS, The imperfection of voting laws across the country is not proof that H.R. 1 is necessary or appropriate, but rather evidence that United States citizens are continuing to strive toward a more perfect union; and

WHEREAS, Forcing completely new standards, procedures, and expectations into state election systems, which are not built for those requirements, as is the case under H.R. 1, would bring chaos to those election systems, and that chaos would bring with it a lack of trust by the people in the results of those elections; and

WHEREAS, In Ohio, a state whose elections have long been 30 under the watchful eye of the nation, we have developed a system 31 that has ensured voters have confidence in the outcome of our 32 elections. Voter fraud and voter suppression are exceedingly 33 rare. Our efforts to strengthen the security of our elections 34 have become a national model. States are even coming to us to 35 learn our best election practices so they can mirror them back 36 home; now therefore be it 37

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 134th General 38
Assembly of the State of Ohio, affirm our belief in the federal 39
structure of the United States government and declare current 40
voting laws a credit to the design of federal government to 41
allow for democratic experimentation throughout the several 42
states; and be it further 43

RESOLVED, That we urge the United States Congress not to

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adopt H.R. 1 of the 117th Congress; and be it further

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RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives	46
transmit a duly authenticated copy of this resolution to the	47
Speaker and Clerk of the United States House of Representatives,	48
the President Pro Tempore and Secretary of the United States	49
Senate, the members of the Ohio Congressional delegation, and	50
the news media of Ohio so they may be apprised of the sense of	51
the General Assembly of the State of Ohio in this matter.	52
