A BILL

То	amend sections 3727.11, 3727.12, 3727.13, and	1
	3727.14 and to enact section 3727.131 of the	2
	Revised Code regarding the collection of stroke	3
	care data and the recognition of thrombectomy-	4
	capable stroke centers.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3727.11, 3727.12, 3727.13, and	6
3727.14 be amended and section 3727.131 of the Revised Code be	7
enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 3727.11. A hospital shall not represent itself as a	9
comprehensive stroke center, thrombectomy-capable stroke center,	10
primary stroke center, or acute stroke ready hospital unless it	11
is recognized as such by the department of health under section	12
3727.13 of the Revised Code.	13
This section does not prohibit a hospital from	14
representing itself as having a relationship or affiliation with	15
a hospital recognized by the department of health under section	16
3727.13 of the Revised Code or a hospital in another state that	17

is certified as a comprehensive stroke center, thrombectomy-	18
capable stroke center, primary stroke center, or acute stroke	19
ready hospital by an accrediting organization approved by the	20
federal centers for medicare and medicaid services.	21
Sec. 3727.12. (A) A person or government entity seeking	22
recognition of a hospital as a comprehensive stroke center,	23
thrombectomy-capable stroke center, primary stroke center, or	24
acute stroke ready hospital by the department of health under	25
section 3727.13 of the Revised Code shall file with the	26
department an application for recognition. The application shall	27
be submitted in the manner prescribed by the department.	28
(B)(1) To be eligible for recognition as a comprehensive	29
stroke center under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code, a	30
hospital must be certified as a comprehensive stroke center by	31
an accrediting organization approved by the federal centers for	32
medicare and medicaid services or an organization acceptable to	33
the department under division (C) of this section.	34
(2) To be eligible for recognition as a thrombectomy-	35
capable stroke center under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code,	36
a hospital must be certified as a thrombectomy-capable stroke	37
center by an accrediting organization approved by the federal	38
centers for medicare and medicaid services or an organization	39
acceptable to the department under division (C) of this section.	40
(3) To be eligible for recognition as a primary stroke	41
center under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code, a hospital	42
must be certified as a primary stroke center by an accrediting	43
organization approved by the federal centers for medicare and	44
medicaid services or an organization acceptable to the	45
department under division (C) of this section.	46

$\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ To be eligible for recognition as an acute stroke	47
ready hospital under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code, a	48
hospital must be certified as an acute stroke ready hospital by	49
an accrediting organization approved by the federal centers for	50
medicare and medicaid services or an organization acceptable to	51
the department under division (C) of this section.	52
(C) For purposes of division (B) of this section, to be	53
acceptable to the department an organization must certify	54
comprehensive stroke centers, <u>thrombectomy-capable stroke</u>	55
centers, primary stroke centers, or acute stroke ready hospitals	56
in accordance with nationally recognized certification	57
guidelines.	58
Sec. 3727.13. (A)(1) The department of health shall	59
recognize as a comprehensive stroke center a hospital that	60
satisfies the requirements of division (B)(1) of section 3727.12	61
of the Revised Code and submits a complete application.	62
(2) (a) (2) The department shall recognize as a	63
thrombectomy-capable stroke center a hospital that satisfies the	64
requirements of division (B)(2) of section 3727.12 of the	65
Revised Code and submits a complete application.	66
(3)(a) The department shall recognize as a primary stroke	67
center a hospital that satisfies the requirements of division	68
$\frac{\text{(B)}(2)}{\text{(B)}(3)}$ of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code and submits	69
a complete application.	70
(b) If a hospital satisfying the requirements of division	71
$\frac{\text{(B)}(2)}{\text{(B)}(3)}$ of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code has	72
attained supplementary levels of stroke care distinction as	73
identified by an accrediting organization approved by the	74
federal centers for medicare and medicaid services or an	75

organization accepted by the department under section 3727.12 of	76
the Revised Code, including by offering patients mechanical	77
endovascular therapy, the department shall include that	78
distinction in its recognition.	79
$\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ The department shall recognize as an acute stroke	80
ready hospital a hospital that satisfies the requirements of	81
division $\frac{(B)(3)}{(B)(4)}$ of section 3727.12 of the Revised Code	82
and submits a complete application.	83
(B) The department shall end its recognition of a hospital	84
made under division (A) of this section if the accrediting	85
organization described in division (B) of section 3727.12 of the	86
Revised Code that certified the hospital revokes, rescinds, or	87
otherwise terminates the hospital's certification with that	88
organization or the certification expires.	89
(C) Not later than the first day of January and July each	90
year, the department shall compile and send a list of hospitals	91
recognized under division (A) of this section to the medical	92
director and cooperating physician advisory board of each	93
emergency medical service organization, as defined in section	94
4765.01 of the Revised Code. The department also shall maintain	95
a comprehensive list of recognized hospitals on its internet web	96
site and update the list not later than thirty days after a	97
hospital is recognized under division (A) of this section or its	98
recognition ends under division (B) of this section.	99
Sec. 3727.131. (A) (1) In an effort to improve the quality	100
of care for patients affected by stroke, the department of	101
health shall establish and maintain a process for the	102
collection, transmission, compilation, and oversight of data	103
related to stroke care. Such data shall be collected,	104
transmitted, compiled, and overseen in a manner prescribed by	105

the director of health.	
As part of the process and except as provided in division	107
(A) (2) of this section, the department shall establish or	108
utilize a stroke registry database to store information,	109
statistics, and other data on stroke care, including	110
information, statistics, and data that align with nationally	111
recognized treatment guidelines and performance measures.	112
(2) If the department established or utilized, prior to	113
the effective date of this section, a stroke registry database	114
that meets the requirements of this section, then both of the	115
<pre>following apply:</pre>	116
(a) Division (A)(1) of this section shall not be construed	117
to require the department to establish or utilize another such	118
database.	119
(b) The department shall maintain both the process and	120
stroke registry database described in this section, including in	121
the event federal moneys are no longer available to support the	122
process or database.	123
(B) The director of health shall adopt rules as necessary	124
to implement this section, including rules specifying all of the	125
<pre>following:</pre>	126
(1) The information, statistics, and other data to be	127
collected, which shall do both of the following:	128
(a) Align with stroke consensus metrics developed and	129
approved by both of the following:	130
(i) The United States centers for disease control and	131
<pre>prevention;</pre>	132
(ii) Accreditation organizations that are approved by the	133

United States centers for medicare and medicaid services and	134
that certify stroke centers.	135
(b) Include at a minimum both of the following:	136
(i) Data that is consistent with nationally recognized	137
treatment guidelines for patients with confirmed stroke;	138
(ii) In the case of mechanical endovascular thrombectomy,	139
data regarding the treatment's processes, complications, and	140
outcomes, including data required by national certifying	141
organizations.	142
(2) The manner in which the information, statistics, and	143
other data are to be collected;	144
(3) The manner in which the information, statistics, and	145
other data are to be transmitted for inclusion in the stroke	146
registry database.	147
(C) When adopting rules as described in division (B) of	148
this section, all of the following apply:	149
(1) The director of health shall do all of the following:	150
(a) Consider nationally recognized stroke care performance	151
measures;	152
(b) Designate an electronic platform for the collection	153
and transmission of data.	154
When designating the platform, the director shall consider	155
nationally recognized stroke data platforms.	156
(c) In an effort to avoid duplication and redundancy,	157
coordinate, to every extent possible, with hospitals recognized	158
by the department under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code and	159
national voluntary health organizations involved in stroke	160

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quality improvement.	161
(2) The director of health may specify that, of the	162
information, statistics, or other data that is collected, only	163
samples are to be transmitted for inclusion in the stroke	164
registry database.	165
(3) Notwithstanding any provision of section 121.95 of the	166
Revised Code to the contrary, a regulatory restriction contained	167
in a rule adopted under this section is not subject to sections	168
121.95 to 121.953 of the Revised Code.	169
(D)(1) Except as provided in division (D)(2) of this	170
section, each hospital that is recognized by the department	171
under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code as a comprehensive	172
stroke center, thrombectomy-capable stroke center, or primary	173
stroke center shall do both of the following:	174
(a) Collect the information, statistics, and other data	175
specified by the director in rules adopted under division (B) of	176
this section;	177
(b) Transmit the information, statistics, and other data	178
for inclusion in the stroke registry database.	179
A hospital may contract with a third-party organization	180
for the collection and transmission of the information,	181
statistics, and other data described in this division. If a	182
hospital contracts with a third-party organization, the	183
organization shall collect and transmit such information,	184
statistics, and other data for inclusion in the stroke registry	185
database.	186
(2) The data described in division (B)(1)(b)(ii) of this	187
section shall be collected and transmitted only by a hospital	188
that is recognized by the department under section 3727.13 of	189

the Revised Code as a thrombectomy-capable stroke center.	190
(3) In the case of a hospital that is recognized by the	191
department under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code as an acute	192
stroke ready hospital, the collection and transmission of the	193
data described in division (B) of this section is encouraged.	194
(E) The information, statistics, or other data collected	195
or transmitted as required or encouraged by this section shall	196
not identify or tend to identify any particular patient.	197
(F) The department may establish an oversight committee to	198
advise and monitor the department in implementing this section	199
and to assist the department in developing short- and long-term	200
goals for the stroke registry database.	201
If established, the membership of the committee shall	202
consist of individuals with expertise or experience in data	203
collection, data management, or stroke care, including both of	204
the following:	205
(1) Individuals representing organizations advocating on	206
behalf of those with stroke or cardiovascular conditions;	207
(2) Individuals representing hospitals recognized by the	208
department under section 3727.13 of the Revised Code.	209
Sec. 3727.14. If an accrediting organization approved by	210
the federal centers for medicare and medicaid services or an	211
organization that certifies hospitals in accordance with	212
nationally recognized certification guidelines establishes a	213
level of stroke certification that is in addition to the three-	214
<u>four</u> levels described in sections 3727.11 to 3727.13 of the	215
Revised Code, the department of health shall recognize a	216
hospital certified at that additional level.	217

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For purposes of this section, the department and a	218
hospital shall comply with sections 3727.11 to 3727.13 of the	219
Revised Code as if the certification and recognition described	220
in this section were one of the three four levels described in	221
sections 3727.11 to 3727.13 of the Revised Code.	222
Section 2. That existing sections 3727.11, 3727.12,	223
3727.13, and 3727.14 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	224
Section 3. The enactment by this act of section 3727.131	225
of the Revised Code takes effect six months after the effective	226
date of this section.	227
