	private nonresidential contractors, and certain	4
	employers to use E-verify.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1 . That sections 4151.01, 4151.02, 4151.03,	6
4151.10, 4151.11, 4151.12, and 4151.13 of the Revised Code be	7
enacted to read as follows:	8
Sec. 4151.01. As used in this section and sections 4151.02	9
to 4151.03 of the Revised Code:	10
(A) "Bidder" means an individual or entity who submits a	11
bid to a state agency or political subdivision to perform work	12
under a public improvement or service contract.	13
(B) "Contractor" means any individual or entity who	14
directs, supervises, or has responsibility for the means,	15

method, and manner of implementing a public improvement or	16
service contract, and any subcontractor who performs specialized	17
work on the contractor's behalf regardless of the	18
<pre>subcontractor's tier.</pre>	19
(C) "E-verify" means the employment verification program	20
as jointly administered by the United States department of	21
homeland security and the social security administration under 8	22
U.S.C. 1324a, or any of its successor programs.	23
(D) "Political subdivision" means any body corporate and	24
politic that is responsible for governmental activities in a	25
geographic area smaller than the state.	26
(E) "Public improvement" has the same meaning as in	27
section 9.75 of the Revised Code.	28
(F) "Services" means labor, time, or effort, by a person	29
or persons, not involving the delivery of a specific end product	30
other than a report.	31
(G) "State agency" means any organized body, office,	32
agency, institution, or other entity established by the laws of	33
the state for the exercise of any function of state government.	34
Sec. 4151.02. (A) Each state agency or political_	35
subdivision desiring to enter or renew a contract for a public	36
improvement or services on and after the effective date of this	37
section shall include both of the following terms in the	38
<pre>contract:</pre>	39
(1) A provision requiring the contractor who is awarded	40
the contract to use e-verify to confirm the identity and legal	41
working status of each employee hired by the contractor with	42
respect to both of the following types of employees of the	43
<pre>contractor:</pre>	44

(a) All individuals hired during the contract term by the	45
<pre>contractor to perform duties within this state;</pre>	46
(b) All individuals assigned by the contractor to perform	47
work within this state on the contract.	48
(2) A provision that the state agency or political	49
subdivision shall cancel the contract if, after awarding the	50
contract, the contractor does not use e-verify to verify the	51
identity and legal working status of each individual hired or	52
assigned by the contractor as required by this section.	53
(B) No state agency or political subdivision shall award a	54
a contract for a public improvement or services to a bidder	55
unless the contract contains terms consistent with division (A)	56
of this section. Any contract entered into in violation of this	57
section is void.	58
Sec. 4151.03. (A) The attorney general shall conduct	59
periodic reviews of state agencies and political subdivisions to	60
ensure that state agencies and political subdivisions are	61
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including within their public improvement and service contracts	
provisions required by division (A) of section 4151.02 of the	63
Revised Code.	64
(B) Each state agency or political subdivision found in	65
violation of division (B) of section 4151.02 of the Revised Code	66
shall be fined five thousand dollars per violation.	67
Sec. 4151.10. As used in this section and sections 4151.11	68
to 4151.13 of the Revised Code:	69
(A) "E-verify" means the employment verification program	70
jointly administered by the United States department of homeland	71
security and the social security administration under 8 U.S.C.	72
1324a, or any of its successor programs.	73

(B) "Employer" means the state, any political subdivision	74
of the state, any employer employing seventy-five or more	75
individuals within the state, and any nonresidential	76
construction contractor employing one or more individuals within	77
the state.	78
(C) "Nonresidential construction contractor" means any	79
individual or contracting company that satisfies both of the	80
<pre>following:</pre>	81
(1) Has responsibility for the means, method, and manner	82
of construction, improvement, renovation, repair, or maintenance	83
on a nonresidential construction project with respect to one or	84
more trades and who offers, identifies, advertises, or otherwise	85
holds out or represents that the individual or contracting	86
company is permitted or qualified to perform or have	87
responsibility for the means, method, and manner of	88
construction, improvement, renovation, repair, or maintenance	89
with respect to one or more trades on a construction project;	90
(2) Does either of the following:	91
(a) Performs construction, improvement, or renovation on a	92
nonresidential construction project with respect to the	93
<pre>individual's or contracting company's trade;</pre>	94
(b) Employs tradespersons who perform construction,	95
improvement, or renovation on a nonresidential construction	96
project with respect to the individual's or contracting	97
<pre>company's trades.</pre>	98
(D) "Nonresidential construction project" means a	99
construction project involving a building or structure subject	100
to Chapter 3781. of the Revised Code and the rules adopted under	101
that chapter, but not any of the following:	102

(1) An industrialized unit, manufactured home, or a	103
residential building as defined in section 3781.06 of the	104
Revised Code;	105
(2) A building or structure that is incidental to the use	106
of the land on which the building or structure is located for	107
agricultural purposes as defined in section 3781.06 of the	108
Revised Code;	109
(3) A mobile home as defined in section 4501.01 of the	110
Revised Code.	111
(E) "State contract" has the same meaning as in section	112
9.242 of the Revised Code.	113
Sec. 4151.11. (A) Every employer shall do both of the	114
<pre>following:</pre>	115
(1) After hiring an employee, verify the employment	116
eligibility of the employee through the e-verify program;	117
(2) Keep a record of the verification for the duration of	118
the employee's employment with the employer or three years,	119
whichever is longer.	120
(B) A contract for a nonresidential construction project	121
entered into on or after the effective date of this section	122
shall include a provision requiring the nonresidential	123
construction contractor responsible for the project and any	124
subcontractor, regardless of tier, that provides construction	125
services with respect to the contract to use e-verify to confirm	126
the identity and work eligibility of any tradesperson assigned	127
to perform work on the project.	128
Sec. 4151.12. (A) (1) The attorney general shall prescribe	129
a complaint form for an individual to allege a violation of	130

section 4151.11 of the Revised Code. The attorney general shall	131
not require the complainant to list the complainant's social	132
security number on the complaint form or to have the form	133
notarized. A complainant shall submit the complaint to the	134
attorney general. Except as provided in division (B) of this	135
section, the attorney general shall investigate any violation of	136
section 4151.11 of the Revised Code alleged in a prescribed form	137
submitted to the attorney general.	138
(2) This section does not prohibit an individual from	139
filing an anonymous complaint on a form other than the	140
prescribed complaint form. Except as provided in division (B) of	141
this section, the attorney general may, but is not required to,	142
investigate a violation of section 4151.11 of the Revised Code	143
alleged in form other than a prescribed form.	144
(B) The attorney general shall not investigate a complaint	145
that is based solely on race, color, or national origin.	146
(C) Any local law enforcement officer may assist in	147
investigating a complaint filed under this section.	148
(D) If the attorney general conducts an investigation	149
under this section and determines that reasonable evidence	150
exists that a person violated section 4151.11 of the Revised	151
Code, the attorney general shall bring a civil action for a	152
violation of section 4151.11 of the Revised Code against the	153
person in the court of common pleas of the county where the	154
person is located or does business.	155
Sec. 4151.13. (A) If a court, pursuant to an action	156
brought under section 4151.12 of the Revised Code, determines	157
that a person has violated section 4151.11 of the Revised Code,	158
the court shall do both of the following:	159

(1) Order the person to pay five thousand dollars for each	160
violation of section 4151.11 of the Revised Code;	161
(2) Order that the person is not eligible to bid for or	162
participate in any state contract for a period of one year.	163
(B) After the one-year period described in division (A)(2)	164
of this section has elapsed, a person who has been ordered	165
ineligible under division (A)(2) of this section may be eligible	166
to bid for and participate in state contracts if the person	167
files a sworn affidavit with the attorney general that one year	168
or more has elapsed since the order described in division (A)(2)	169
of this section and that the person has not violated section	170
4151.11 of the Revised Code during the one-year period.	171
(C) The attorney general shall maintain a list of all	172
persons ineligible to bid for or participate in any state	173
contract for a period of one year under division (A) of this	174
section. The attorney general shall remove a person from the	175
list when the one-year period ends. The attorney general also	176
shall maintain a record of all affidavits filed with the	177
attorney general under division (B) of this section.	178
