A BILL

T,O	enact sections 103.55, 103.551, and 103.552 of	-
	the Revised Code to establish the Adverse	2
	Childhood Experiences Study Commission.	

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 103.55, 103.551, and 103.552 of	4
the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 103.55. (A) As used in this section and sections	6
103.551 and 103.552 of the Revised Code, "adverse childhood	7
experiences" are potentially traumatic events that occur in	8
childhood, including various forms of physical and emotional	9
abuse; neglect; and household, environmental, or community	10
dysfunction.	11
(B) The adverse childhood experiences study commission is	12
created. The commission shall recommend legislative strategies	13
to the general assembly for addressing the prevalence and	14
effects of adverse childhood experiences.	15

(C) The commission shall consist of the following members:	16
(1) The following members appointed by the governor:	17
(a) One social worker or school counselor who has worked	18
with children experiencing violence, abuse, and neglect;	19
(b) One current or former law enforcement officer with	20
expertise in community violence or domestic violence;	21
(c) One current or former judge who presides or presided	22
over domestic relations or juvenile proceedings;	23
(d) One individual authorized under Chapter 4732. of the	24
Revised Code to practice psychology;	25
(e) One individual authorized under Chapter 4731. of the	26
Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic	27
medicine and surgery who practices pediatric medicine;	28
(f) Two individuals who have earned a doctoral degree in a	29
social science field and are experts on adverse childhood	30
experiences and employed as a professor or researcher;	
(g) One representative of the department of children and	32
youth;	33
(h) One person who holds certification as a crisis	34
intervention specialist from a national credentialing	35
organization;	36
(i) One representative from the children's trust fund;	37
(j) One clinician who works in a residential facility as	38
defined in section 5103.05 or 5119.34 of the Revised Code that	39
serves children with behavioral health needs and has experience	40
<pre>in trauma-informed care;</pre>	41
(k) Two individuals with lived experience in adverse	42

childhood experiences or parents of such an individual;	
(1) One representative of the association of Ohio health	44
commissioners or a successor organization;	45
(m) One representative of the Ohio association of county	46
behavioral health authorities or a successor organization;	47
(n) One mental health professional who serves infants or	48
children up to five years of age;	49
(o) One representative of the department of mental health	50
and addiction services.	51
(2) Two members of the senate, one from the majority party	52
and one from the minority party, both appointed by the president	53
of the senate;	54
(3) Two members of the house of representatives, one from	55
the majority party and one from the minority party, both	56
appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.	57
(D) Not later than sixty days after the effective date of	58
this section, initial appointments shall be made to the	59
commission. Thereafter, appointments shall be made within thirty	60
days of a vacancy in the commission. Following the commencement	61
of a new general assembly, the president of the senate and the	62
speaker of the house of representatives shall make new	63
appointments to the commission.	64
(E) In odd-numbered years, the commission shall designate	65
by majority vote one commission member from the senate as the	66
commission chairperson, and one commission member from the house	67
of representatives as the vice-chairperson. In even-numbered	68
years, the commission shall designate by majority vote one	69
commission member from the house of representatives as the	70

commission chairperson, and one commission member from the	
enate as the vice-chairperson.	
(F) Members shall serve without compensation except to the	73
extent that serving on the commission is considered part of the	74
member's regular duties of employment.	75
(G) A majority of the members constitutes a quorum for the	76
conduct of meetings. The commission shall comply with public	77
records and open meetings requirements as described in sections	78
121.22 and 149.43 of the Revised Code.	79
(H) The commission shall abide by rules governing the	80
senate and the house of representatives that pertain to decorum.	81
(I) The general assembly shall provide meeting space,	82
staff services, and other technical assistance required by the	83
commission in carrying out its duties.	84
Sec. 103.551. (A) The adverse childhood experiences study	85
commission shall hold its first meeting not more than sixty days	86
after initial appointments are made. Thereafter, the commission	87
shall meet once quarterly.	88
(B) The first meeting of each calendar year shall be an	89
organizational meeting to elect a chairperson and vice-	90
chairperson, and set a calendar for the remainder of the year.	91
(C) During one meeting each year, each member appointed by	92
the governor shall present to the commission information	93
relevant to the member's area of expertise, including	94
suggestions for legislative approaches to address the prevalence	95
and effects of adverse childhood experiences.	96
Sec. 103.552. (A) The adverse childhood experiences study	97
commission shall prepare an annual report summarizing possible	98

of adverse childhood experiences.	
(B) The commission shall submit a copy of each report to	101
the general assembly. The report shall be submitted in	102
accordance with section 101.68 of the Revised Code.	103
(C) The initial report shall be submitted not later than	104
one year after the effective date of this section, and annually	105
thereafter.	106
(D) On submission of its fourth report, the commission	107
shall cease to exist.	108
