BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 5535.17 of the Revised Code be	5
enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 5535.17. (A) As used in this section:	7
(1) "Road service crew member" means an individual that is	8
employed by a road service employer to perform road	9
construction, maintenance, or repair.	10
(2) "Road service employer" means a person or public body	11
that is responsible for employing road service crew members to	12
perform road construction, maintenance, or repair.	13
(3) "Public body" means the state or a county, township,	14
municipal corporation, or any other body corporate and politic	15
that is responsible for government activities in a geographic	16
area smaller than that of the state.	17

(D) (1) When performing duties on a public word or public	1.0	
(B)(1) When performing duties on a public road or public	18	
right-of-way, including road construction, maintenance, and	19	
repair, a road service crew member who discovers a deceased dog	20	
or cat shall use a microchip scanning device on the animal prior	21	
to its disposal. A road service employer shall provide microchip		
scanners to its road service crew members for such purpose.		
(2) If, after scanning, a road service crew member	24	
determines the contact information for the deceased dog or cat,	25	
the road service crew member shall communicate that information	26	
to the crew member's road service employer. The road service	27	
employer, if not a public body, shall notify the public body	28	
with jurisdiction over the road or highway on which the deceased	29	
dog or cat was discovered and shall deliver the deceased animal	30	
to the public body. A public body in possession of such a dog or	31	
cat shall make a reasonable effort to contact any person		
identified in the contact information.	33	
(3) After contacting the identified person, the public	34	
body shall hold the deceased dog or cat in a sanitary manner for	35	
twenty-four hours to provide the identified person with an	36	
opportunity to retrieve the deceased animal. If the identified	37	
person does not retrieve the deceased dog or cat within the	38	
twenty-four hour period, the public body may dispose of the	39	
deceased animal. If the public body is not able to contact any		
person included in the contact information identified by a		
microchip scan after a reasonable effort, the public body may		
dispose of the deceased dog or cat.	43
