A BILL

To amend sections 3319.226 and 3319.229 and to	1
enact section 3319.2212 of the Revised Code	2
regarding the teaching of career-technical	3
education.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3319.226 and 3319.229 be amended	5
and section 3319.2212 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	6
follows:	7
Sec. 3319.226. (A) Beginning July 1, 2019, the state board	8
of education shall issue educator licenses for substitute	9
teaching only under this section.	10
(B) Except as provided in division (E) of this section,	11
(b) Except as provided in division (E) of this section,	1 L
the state board shall adopt rules establishing standards and	12
requirements for obtaining a license under this section and for	13
renewal of the license. Except as provided in division $\frac{(F)-(G)}{(G)}$	14
of section 3319.229 of the Revised Code, the rules shall require	15
an applicant to hold a post-secondary degree, but not in any	16
specified subject area. The rules also shall allow the holder of	17

a license issued under this section to work: 18 (1) For an unlimited number of school days if the license 19 holder has a post-secondary degree in either education or a 20 subject area directly related to the subject of the class the 21 license holder will teach; 22 (2) For one full semester, subject to the approval of the 23 employing school district board of education, if the license 24 holder has a post-secondary degree in a subject area that is not 25 directly related to the subject of the class that the license 26 holder will teach. 27 The district superintendent may request that the board 28 approve one or more additional subsequent semester-long periods 29 of teaching for the license holder. 30 (C) The rules adopted under division (B) of this section 31 shall permit a substitute career-technical teaching license 32 holder to teach outside the license holder's certified career 33 field for up to one semester, subject to approval of the 34 employing school district superintendent. 35 (D) Any license issued or renewed under former section 36 3319.226 of the Revised Code that was still in force on November 37 2, 2018, shall remain in force for the remainder of the term for 38 which it was issued or renewed. Upon the expiration of that 39 term, the holder of that license shall be subject to licensure 40 under the rules adopted under this section. 41 (E) The state board shall issue an educator license for 42

substitute teaching in accordance with Chapter 4796. of the43Revised Code to an applicant if either of the following applies:44

(1) The applicant holds a license in another state. 45

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(2) The applicant has satisfactory work experience, a
government certification, or a private certification as
described in that chapter as a substitute teacher in a state
that does not issue that license.

Sec. 3319.229. (A) (1) Notwithstanding the repeal of former 50 section 3319.229 of the Revised Code by S.B. 216 of the 132nd 51 general assembly, the state board of education shall accept 52 applications for new, and for renewal of, professional career-53 technical teaching licenses through June 30, 2019, and issue 54 them on the basis of the applications received by that date in 55 accordance with the rules described in that former section. 56 Except as otherwise provided in <u>section 3319.2212 of the Revised</u> 57 Code, and divisions (A) (2) and (3) of this section, beginning 58 July 1, 2019, the state board shall issue career-technical 59 workforce development educator licenses only under this section. 60

(2) An individual who, on July 1, 2019, holds a 61 professional career-technical teaching license issued under the 62 rules described in former section 3319.229 of the Revised Code, 63 may continue to renew that license in accordance with those 64 rules for the remainder of the individual's teaching career. 65 However, nothing in this division shall be construed to prohibit 66 the individual from applying to the state board for a career-67 technical workforce development educator license under this 68 section. 69

(3) An individual who, on July 1, 2019, holds an
alternative resident educator license for teaching careertechnical education issued under section 3319.26 of the Revised
Code may, upon the expiration of the license, apply for a
professional career-technical teaching license issued under the
rules described in former section 3319.229 of the Revised Code.

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Such an individual may continue to renew the professional 76 license in accordance with those rules for the remainder of the 77 individual's teaching career. However, nothing in this division 78 shall be construed to prohibit the individual from applying to 79 the state board for a career-technical workforce development 80 educator license under this section. 81

(B) Except as provided in division $\frac{(G)}{(H)}$ of this 82 section, the state board, in collaboration with the chancellor 83 of higher education, shall adopt rules establishing standards 84 and requirements for obtaining a two-year initial career-85 technical workforce development educator license and a five-year 86 advanced career-technical workforce development educator 87 license. Each license shall be valid for teaching career-88 technical education or workforce development programs in grades 89 four through twelve. The rules shall require applicants for 90 either license to have a high school diploma or a certificate of 91 high school equivalence as awarded under section 3301.80 of the 92 Revised Code or as recognized as the equivalent of such 93 certificate under division (C) of that section. 94

(C) (1) (C) Except as provided in division (G) (H) of this 95 section, the state board shall issue an initial career-technical 96 workforce development educator license to an applicant upon 97 request from the applicant or the superintendent of a school 98 district that has agreed to employ the applicant. In making the 99 request, the applicant or superintendent shall provide 100 documentation, in accordance with procedures prescribed by the 101 state board, showing that the applicant has at least five years 102 of work experience, or the equivalent, in the subject area in 103 which the applicant will teach. The license requested by a 104 superintendent shall be valid for teaching only in the 105 requesting district. The <u>applicant or</u> superintendent also shall 106

provide documentation, in accordance with procedures prescribed	107
by the state board, that the applicant is enrolled in a program	108
described in division (D) of this section.	109
As a condition of continuing to hold the initial career-	110
technical workforce development license, the holder of the	111
license shall be participating in a program described in	112
division (D) of this section.	113
The state board shall renew an initial career-technical	114
workforce development educator license if the supervisor of the	115
program described in division (D) of this section or the	116
superintendent of the employing school district indicate that	117
the applicant is making sufficient progress in both the program	118
and, if applicable, the teaching position.	119
(D) An applicant for a license under division (C) of this	120
section shall be enrolled in one of the following:	121
<u>(1) A</u> in a career-technical workforce development educator	122
preparation program offered by an institution of higher	123
education that has an existing teacher preparatory program in	124
place that meets all of the following criteria:	121
prace that meets all of the following criteria.	125
(a) Is approved by the chancellor of higher education to	126
provide instruction in teaching methods and principles;	127
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(b) Provides classroom support to the license holder;	128
(c) Includes at least three semester hours of coursework	129
in the teaching of reading in the subject area;	130
(d) Is aligned with career-technical education and	131
workforce development competencies developed by the department	132

(e) Uses a summative performance-based assessment	134

developed by the program and aligned to the competencies135described in division (C) (1) (d) (D) (1) (d) of this section to136evaluate the license holder's knowledge and skills;137

(f) Consists of not less than twenty-four semester hoursof coursework, or the equivalent.139

(2) As a condition of continuing to hold the initial
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career-technical workforce development license, the holder of
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the license shall be participating in a career-technical
workforce development educator preparation program described in
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division (C) (1) of this section.

(3) The state board shall renew an initial career-145technical workforce development educator license if the146supervisor of the program described in division (C) (1) of this147section and the superintendent of the employing school district148indicate that the applicant is making sufficient progress in149both the program and the teaching position.150

(D) If the applicant has obtained an offer of employment151as a classroom teacher, a modified educator preparation program152created by one or more lead districts, as defined in section1533317.023 of the Revised Code. The program shall include both of154the following:155

(a) Not less than nine credit hours or three semester156hours of coursework in the area to be taught;157

(b) Not less than forty-five hours of local professional158development designed by the employing district.159

(3) If the applicant has obtained an offer of employment160as a classroom teacher, a two-year alternative career-technical161licensure program under which an employing district provides a162mentoring program that includes all of the following:163

(a) An assigned mentor who holds a license issued under	164
sections 3319.22 to 3319.31 of the Revised Code, or who has	165
served in the capacity of an administrator;	166
<u>bervea in the capacity of an adminiberator</u>	100
(b) A competency based self-assessment developed and	167
approved by the state board of education, in consultation with	168
individuals in the career-technical education field;	169
(c) A personal learning plan approved by the lead	170
district, or the district's designee;	171
(d) Participation in a structured mentoring program	172
aligned to the individual's personal learning plan and	173
consisting of ninety clock hours of professional development	174
during the initial two-year license period.	175
<u>(E)</u> Except as provided in division (G) (H) of this	176
section, the state board shall issue an advanced career-	177
technical workforce development educator license to an applicant	178
who has successfully completed the either of the following:	179
<u>(1) A program described in division (C)(1) (D)(1) of this</u>	180
section, as indicated by the supervisor of the program, and who	181
demonstrates mastery of the applicable career-technical	182
education and workforce development competencies described in	183
division (C)(1)(d) (D)(1)(d) of this section in the teaching	184
position, as indicated by the superintendent of the employing	185
school district;	186
(2) A program described in division (D)(2) or (3) of this	187
section, as indicated by the supervisor of the program, and has	188
taught under the initial career-technical workforce development	189
educator license for four school years.	190
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(E) (F) The holder of an advanced career-technical	191
workforce development educator license shall work with a local	192

professional development committee established under section1933319.22 of the Revised Code in meeting requirements for renewal194of the license.195

(F) (G) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 3319.226196of the Revised Code, the state board shall not require any197applicant for an educator license for substitute teaching who198holds a license issued under this section to hold a post-199secondary degree in order to be issued a license under section2003319.226 of the Revised Code to work as a substitute teacher for201career-technical education classes.202

(G) (H)The state board shall issue a license to practice203as an initial career-technical workforce development educator or204advanced career-technical workforce development educator in205accordance with Chapter 4796. of the Revised Code to an206applicant if either of the following applies:207

(1) The applicant holds a license in another state. 208

(2) The applicant has satisfactory work experience, a
government certification, or a private certification as
described in that chapter as a career-technical workforce
development educator in a state that does not issue one or both
of those licenses.

Sec. 3319.2212. (A) (1) Notwithstanding anything to the214contrary in section 3319.229 of the Revised Code, the state215board of education shall issue a two-year career-technical216educator license to an individual who meets all of the following217conditions:218

(a) The individual holds a valid educator license issued219under sections 3319.22 to 3319.31 of the Revised Code.220

(b) The individual has at least five years of work 221

experience in the subject area the individual will teach, or the	222
individual's work experience has been affirmed by a panel of	223
experts as required by the state board of education.	224
(c) The superintendent of the employing school district	225
has made an informal recommendation of appointment for the	226
individual to a position as a career-technical educator.	227
(2) Each employing district or school shall assign a	228
mentor to any teacher it employs to teach under this division.	229
<u>A license issued under this section shall be renewable</u>	230
only once to enable the license holder to apply for a	231
professional career-technical workforce development educator	232
license.	233
(B) The state board of education shall issue an advanced	234
career-technical workforce development educator license to a	235
person who holds a license issued under division (A) of this	236
section upon the completion of the four years of teaching	237
experience under that license. A license issued under this	238
division shall be valid for five years and shall be renewable.	239
Section 2. That existing sections 3319.226 and 3319.229 of	240
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	241
