### A BILL

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That section 4729.41 of the Revised Code be	5
amended to read as follows:	6
Sec. 4729.41. (A) (1) A pharmacist licensed under this	7
chapter who meets the requirements of division (B) of this	8
section, and a pharmacy intern licensed under this chapter who	9
meets the requirements of division (B) of this section and is	10
working under the direct supervision of a pharmacist who meets	11
the requirements of that division, and a certified pharmacy	12
technician or a registered pharmacy technician who meets the	13
requirements of division (B) of this section and is working	14
under the direct supervision of a pharmacist who meets the	15
requirements of that division, may do any of the following:	16
(a) In the case of administer to an individual who is	17

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seven-five years of age or older but not more than thirteen-	18
years of age, administer to the individual an immunization for	19
any of the following:	
(i) Influenza;	21
(ii) COVID-19;	22
(iii) Any other disease, but only pursuant to a	23
prescription.	
(b) In the case of an individual who is thirteen years of	25
age or older, administer to the individual an immunization for	26
any disease, including an immunization for influenza or COVID-	27
19.	28
(2) As part of engaging in the administration of	29
immunizations or supervising a pharmacy intern's, certified	30
pharmacy technician's, or registered pharmacy technician's	31
administration of immunizations, a pharmacist may administer	32
epinephrine or diphenhydramine, or both, to individuals in	33
emergency situations resulting from adverse reactions to the	
immunizations administered by the pharmacist orpharmacy	35
intern, certified pharmacy technician, or registered pharmacy	36
technician.	37
(B) For a pharmacist <del>or</del> , pharmacy intern, certified	38
pharmacy technician, or registered pharmacy technician to be	39
authorized to engage in the administration of immunizations, the	40
pharmacist or , pharmacy intern, certified pharmacy technician,	41
or registered pharmacy technician shall do all of the following:	42
(1) Successfully complete a course in the administration	43
of immunizations that meets the requirements established in	44
rules adopted under this section for such courses;	45

(2) Receive and maintain certification to perform basic	46
life-support procedures by successfully completing a basic life-	47
support training course that is certified by the American red	48
cross or American heart association or approved by the state	
board of pharmacy;	
(3) Practice in accordance with a protocol that meets the	51
requirements of division (C) of this section.	52

(C) All of the following apply with respect to the	53
protocol required by division (B)(3) of this section:	54
(1) The protocol shall be established by a physician	55
authorized under Chapter 4731. of the Revised Code to practice	56
medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery.	57
(2) The protocol shall specify a definitive set of	58
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treatment guidelines and the locations at which a pharmacist—or	
, pharmacy intern, certified pharmacy technician, or registered	60
<pre>pharmacy technician may engage in the administration of</pre>	61
immunizations.	62
(3) The protocol shall satisfy the requirements	63
established in rules adopted under this section for protocols.	64
(4) The protocol shall include provisions for	65
implementation of the following requirements:	66

(a) The pharmacist <del>or</del> , pharmacy intern, certified	67
pharmacy technician, or registered pharmacy technician who	68
administers an immunization shall observe the individual who	69
receives the immunization to determine whether the individual	70
has an adverse reaction to the immunization. The length of time	71
and location of the observation shall comply with the rules	72
adopted under this section establishing requirements for	73
protocols. The protocol shall specify procedures to be followed	74

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by a pharmacist when administering epinephrine 7 or	75
diphenhydramine, or both, to an individual who has an adverse	76
reaction to an immunization administered by the pharmacist or $\underline{\text{by}}$	77
a pharmacy intern, certified pharmacy technician, or registered	78
pharmacy technician.	
(b) For each immunization administered to an individual by	80
a pharmacist-or-, pharmacy intern, certified pharmacy	81
technician, or registered pharmacy technician, other than an	82
immunization for influenza administered to an individual	83
eighteen years of age or older, the pharmacist—or—, pharmacy	84
intern, certified pharmacy technician, or registered pharmacy	85
technician shall notify the individual's primary care provider	86
or, if the individual has no primary care provider, the board of	87
health of the health district in which the individual resides or	88
the authority having the duties of a board of health for that	89
district under section 3709.05 of the Revised Code. The notice	90
shall be given not later than thirty days after the immunization	91
is administered.	92
(c) For each immunization administered by a pharmacist—or—	93
, pharmacy intern, certified pharmacy technician, or registered	94
pharmacy technician to an individual younger than eighteen years	95
of age, the pharmacist <del>or</del> , a pharmacy intern, certified	96
pharmacy technician, or registered pharmacy technician shall	97
obtain permission from the individual's parent or legal guardian	98
in accordance with the procedures specified in rules adopted	99
under this section.	100
(d) For each immunization administered by a pharmacist,	101
pharmacy intern, certified pharmacy technician, or registered	102
pharmacy technician to an individual who is younger than	103

eighteen years of age, the pharmacist, pharmacy intern,

certified pharmacy technician, or registered pharmacy technician	105
shall inform the individual's parent or legal guardian of the	106
importance of well child visits with a pediatrician or other	107
primary care provider and shall refer patients when appropriate.	
(D)(1) No pharmacist shall do either of the following:	109
(a) Engage in the administration of immunizations unless	110
the requirements of division (B) of this section have been met;	
(b) Delegate to any person the pharmacist's authority to	112
engage in or supervise the administration of immunizations.	113
(2) No pharmacy intern shall engage in the administration	114
of immunizations unless the requirements of division (B) of this	115
section have been met.	116
(3) No certified pharmacy technician or registered	117
pharmacy technician shall engage in the administration of	118
immunizations unless the requirements of division (B) of this	
section have been met.	120
(E)(1) The state board of pharmacy shall adopt rules to	121
implement this section. The rules shall be adopted in accordance	122
with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code and shall include the	123
following:	124
(a) Requirements for courses in administration of	125
immunizations, including requirements that are consistent with	126
any standards established for such courses by the centers for	127
disease control and prevention;	128
(b) Requirements for protocols to be followed by	129
pharmacists—and , pharmacy interns, certified pharmacy	130
technicians, and registered pharmacy technicians in engaging in	131
the administration of immunizations;	132

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(c) Procedures to be followed by pharmacists—and ,	133
pharmacy interns, certified pharmacy technicians, and registered	134
pharmacy technicians in obtaining from the individual's parent	135
or legal guardian permission to administer immunizations to an	136
individual younger than eighteen years of age.	137
(2) Prior to adopting rules regarding requirements for	138
protocols to be followed by pharmacists—and—, pharmacy interns,	139
certified pharmacy technicians, and registered pharmacy	140
technicians in engaging in the administration of immunizations,	141
the state board of pharmacy shall consult with the state medical	142
board and the board of nursing.	
Section 2. That existing section 4729.41 of the Revised	144
Code is hereby repealed.	145
