BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 1349.10 of the Revised Code be	O
enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 1349.10. (A) As used in this section:	8
(1) "Business" means a firm, company, business trust,	9
estate, trust, partnership, limited liability company,	10
association, corporation, sole proprietorship, general	11
partnership, or other business entity. "Business" includes an	12
agent, employee, or independent contractor of any of the	13
foregoing.	14
(2) "Cloud service provider" means a third-party provider	15
of computing resources that a business may access on demand over	16
the internet, including cloud-based application, infrastructure,	17
platform, and storage services.	18

(3) "Distribute" means to issue, sell, give, provide,	19
deliver, transfer, transmute, circulate, or disseminate by any	20
means.	21
(4) "Harmful to juveniles" has the same meaning as in	22
section 2907.01 of the Revised Code.	23
(5) "Internet service provider" means a provider of	24
internet services, including all of the following:	25
(a) Broadband service, however defined or classified by	26
the federal communications commission;	27
(b) Information service or telecommunications service,	28
both as defined in the "Telecommunications Act of 1996," 47	29
U.S.C. 153, as amended;	30
(c) Internet protocol-enabled services, as defined in	31
section 4927.01 of the Revised Code.	32
(6) "Juvenile" means a person under eighteen years of age.	33
(7) "News-gathering organization" means a newspaper,	34
magazine, press association, news agency, news wire service,	35
radio or television station, or similar media. "News-gathering	36
organization" includes a person employed or contracted by any of	37
the foregoing to gather, process, transmit, compile, edit, or	38
disseminate information for the general public.	39
(8) "Publish" means to communicate or make information	40
available to another person or entity.	41
(9) "Publicly available online web site, service, or	42
product" means communications, content, materials, or other	43
information that is accessible, whether free of charge, for a	44
fee, or as part of a subscription-based or other members-only	45
model, over, on, or through the internet, a computer or mobile	46

application, or other type of virtual or digital platform.	47
(10) "Reasonable age verification methods" means verifying	48
that the person seeking to access material is not a juvenile by	49
using any of the following methods:	50
(a) Verification through an independent, third-party	51
verification service that compares the personal information	52
entered by the individual seeking access to the material to the	53
information that is available from a commercially available	54
database, or aggregate of databases, that is regularly used by	55
businesses and government agencies for the purpose of age and	56
<pre>identity verification;</pre>	57
(b) Any commercially reasonable method that relies on	58
public or private transactional data to verify the age of the	59
person attempting to access the material;	60
(c) A state-issued identification card.	61
(11) "Search engine" means a web site, service, or product	62
the predominant or exclusive function of which is to search the	63
internet for other web sites, services, or products, or for	64
information based on a user's query. "Search engine" does not	65
include web sites, services, or products the predominant or	66
exclusive function of which is to conduct an internal search for	67
content on a web site, service, or product that includes a	68
substantial portion of materials that are harmful to juveniles.	69
(12) "Substantial portion" means more than one-third of	70
the total material on an online web site, service, or product.	71
(13) "Transactional data" means a sequence of information	72
that documents an exchange, agreement, or transfer between an	73
individual and a business or third party used for the purpose of	74
satisfying a request or event, including records from mortgage,	75

education, and employment entities.	
(B)(1) A business that publishes, distributes, or	77
otherwise makes available a substantial portion of materials	78
that are harmful to juveniles on a publicly available online web	79
site, service, or product, shall perform reasonable age	80
verification methods to verify the age of any individual	81
attempting to access any material that is harmful to juveniles	
on that web site, service, or product.	83
(2) A business or third party that performs age	84
verification, as required by division (B)(1) of this section,	85
shall not retain any identifying information of the individual	86
after access to the material has been granted or denied.	87
(C) A violation of division (B)(1) or (2) of this section	88
is an unfair or deceptive act or practice in violation of	89
section 1345.02 of the Revised Code. All powers and remedies	90
available to the attorney general to enforce sections 1345.01 to	91
1345.13 of the Revised Code are available to the attorney	92
general to enforce this section.	93
(D) No internet service provider, search engine, cloud	94
service provider, or affiliate or subsidiary of any of the	95
foregoing shall be held to have violated this section solely for	96
providing access or connection to or from a publicly available	97
online web site, service, or product not under the internet	98
service provider's, search engine's, or cloud service	99
provider's, affiliate's, or subsidiary's control, including	100
transmission, downloading, storing, or providing access, to the	101
extent that such internet service provider, search engine, cloud	102
service provider, affiliate, or subsidiary is not responsible	103
for the publication or distribution of the content that	104
constitutes material harmful to juveniles.	105

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(E) This section does not apply to any bona fide news or	106	
<pre>public interest broadcast, web site video, report, or event and</pre>	107	
shall not be construed to affect the rights of a news-gathering	108	
organization.	109
