Master Plan Process

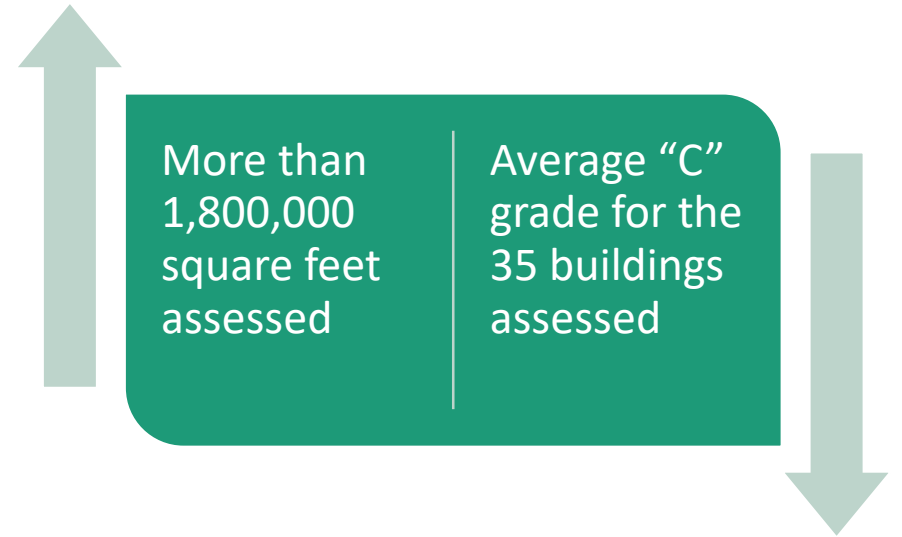
Stakeholder Engagement - Interviews and surveys of **more than 90 stakeholders** from approximately 40 different organizations:

Master Plan Process

Facility condition and assessment of each building with each resulting in a letter grade:

- Structure
- Utilities
- Infrastructure
- Identify necessary renovations
- Suitability for current/future events
- Cost to renovate vs. cost to replace

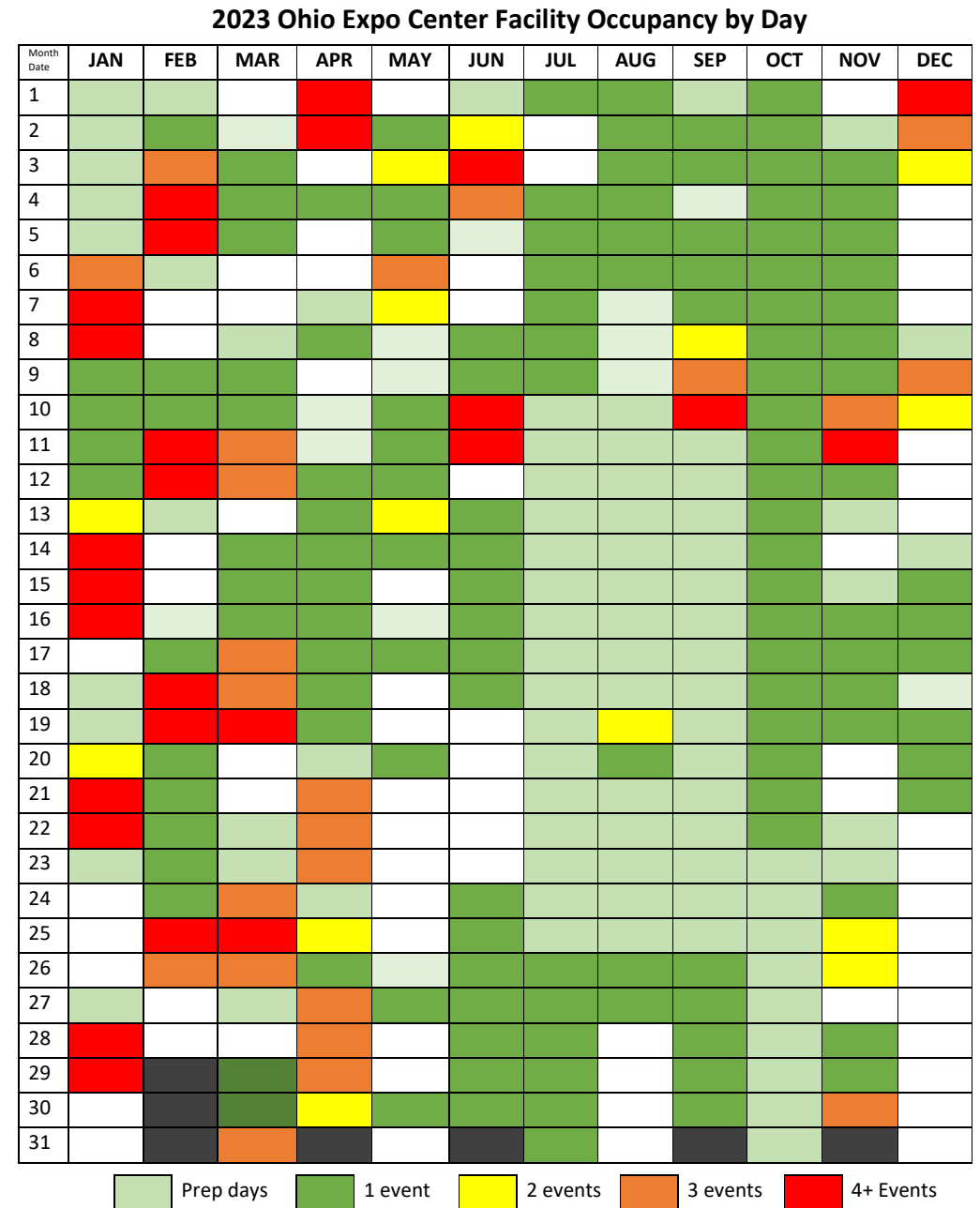

Master Plan Process

Site Utilization

- Current frequency that many buildings are in use for set-up, tear-down, or event days.
- Rental/occupancy rates of individual buildings
- Pictured at right, a graphic showing that the Ohio Expo Center is set to be occupied 293 days of 2023.



Taking into consideration contractual event set-up and departure days, the Ohio Expo Center is slated to be occupied **293 days of 2023**. Of these 293 days, there are 63 days where the grounds are occupied by multiple events held concurrently in separate buildings.

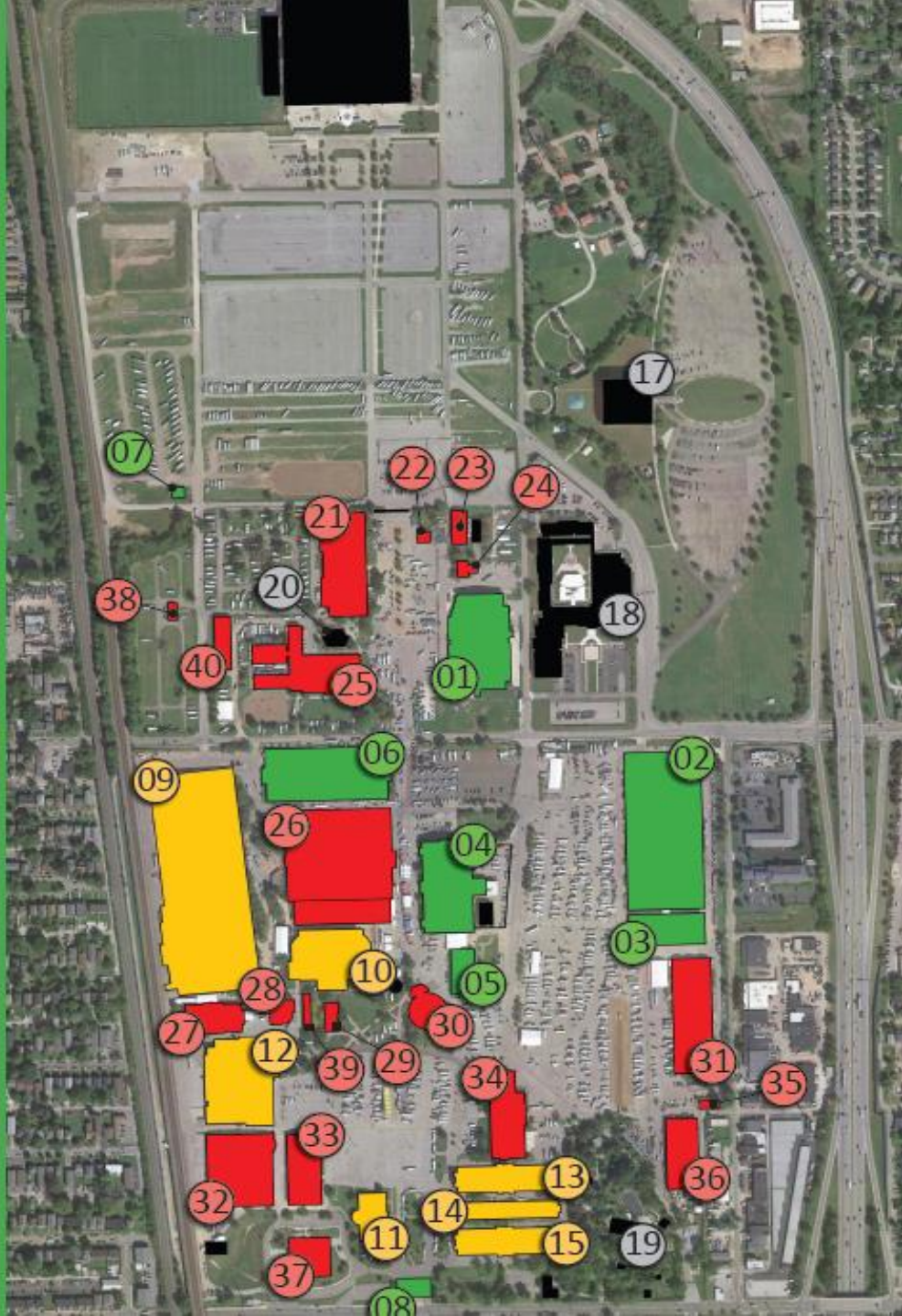
