Resnik was aboard the Challenger when the orbiter exploded only moments after its takeoff. I'm proud to say that the District I represent, District 17 houses the NASA Glenn Research Center in Brook Park, OH, where NASA and the U.S. Government work to research and develop new technology and further our progress in space exploration.

The Wright-Patterson Air Force Base is the premier air base in the United States. Wright-Patt is one of the largest and most impressive Air Force bases in the country, with over 30,000 individuals employed on base, including military members, government workers, and civilian employees. Ohio continues to lead the nation in aviation and aerospace innovation and would be a great home to the Space Command Headquarters.
