


Issue 2 Initiated Statue Chapter 3780 Items of Concern

- o Issue 2 supports Vertical oligopoly and further concentrates power in the hands of a few major players:
 - Most are out of state giants in the cannabis industry.
 - Limits competition and potentially leads to higher prices for consumers.
 - Can stifle innovation and hinder the development of new products and services.
- Small businesses, often thrive in competitive environments but
 - o may face increased challenges and reduced opportunities for growth.
- With limited choices, consumers may experience:
 - reduced quality of service.
 - diminished ability to influence market dynamics through their purchasing decisions.
 - o experience a lack of responsiveness to their needs.
- o Potential for anti-competitive practices, such as collusion or price-fixing, should also be a point of concern.
- Oligopolies may have the incentive and ability to engage in such behaviors, ultimately harming both businesses and consumers by suppressing fair market competition.






Cultivation Sq. Ft. Award by License
