<u> House Bill 311 – Rep. Pizzulli</u>

Chairman Peterson, Vice Chair Thomas, Ranking Member Humphrey, and esteemed colleagues of the House Government Oversight Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide sponsor testimony on House Bill 311, legislation to ensure students are not priced out of watching their high schools participate in playoff games.

Just prior to the kickoff of high school playoff season, it was brought to our attention that drastic increases in ticket prices for high school playoff games are keeping our students from attending these games—a fundamental experience for many students. House Bill 311 will directly address ticket price gouging by requiring student tickets to athletic playoff games to be priced lower than those of adults and ensuring the price of student tickets will be the same whether they are purchased online or with cash.

This legislation not only benefits our students but promotes community pride and unity.
