## Written Proponent Testimony House Bill 84

Chair Ghanbari, Vice Chair Plummer, Ranking Member Thomas, and members of the Ohio House Homeland Security Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony regarding our support for House Bill 84, which would lower the age for an original appointment of a police officer.

The Ohio Municipal League represents more than 730 cities and villages from across the state of Ohio, and the overwhelming majority of these municipalities have their own police departments.

In a recent survey of OML-member communities, recruitment and retention was one of the top challenges our members said they were currently facing – with many of them specifically citing problems with finding qualified individuals to serve as police officers.

By permissively lowering the age someone can become a police officer, Ohio municipalities will have the option to recruit and hire these newly qualified young adults, strengthening their police force while still allowing them with flexibility at the local level to determine how to best develop their new officers.

As many Ohio communities struggle in meeting the basic needs of their residents and businesses, including in public safety, House Bill 84 is an optional tool to help communities have and maintain an adequate police force.

We appreciate the conversation around this topic and thank Representative Demetriou and Representative Williams for sponsoring this legislation and responding to the needs of our municipal safety forces.
