Chair Ghanbari, Vice Chair Plummer, Ranking Member Thomas, and members of the House Homeland Security Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide sponsor testimony on HB 287, which would create the “Terrace Park” license plate. The Village of Terrace Park is a small community within my district situated on the East side of Hamilton County. It is home to around 2,300 residents, according to the most recent census.

Twenty dollars of every “Terrace Park” license plate sold at the Bureau of Motor Vehicles would go directly to the Terrace Park Recreation Commission, the governing body for all youth recreation sports. The Commission works to ensure that every child in Terrace Park has access to sports and related activities, ultimately fostering happy and healthy lives. The funds generated from license plate sales would be used by the Commission to offer scholarships to young athletes and maintain athletic facilities within the Village.
