House Concurrent Resolution 6: Proponent Testimony
House Pensions Committee
Tuesday, May 9, 2022

Chair Young, Vice Chair King, Ranking Member Lightbody, and Members of the Committee:

My name is Mark Hill. I am a middle school math teacher from Worthington and have the honor of serving as the Secretary-Treasurer of the Ohio Education Association (OEA). On behalf of OEA's 120,000 members, thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in support of House Concurrent Resolution 6 (HCR 6).

HCR 6 seeks to urge Congress to repeal the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP). This provision of federal law unfairly punishes public service by reducing the earned Social Security benefits of many Ohioans who also receive a public pension. Because Ohio public employees do not contribute to Social Security, public employees in our state are often adversely affected by the WEP. This is unfair to those who enter public service in our state and may serve to dissuade people from pursuing a career in our public schools.

For decades, OEA members and other affiliates of the National Education Association have urged Congress to fully repeal the WEP as well as the Government Pension Offset (GPO) which reduces the earned Social Security survivor benefits of many Ohioans. Economic security in retirement is an important issue for all Americans. Repeal of these measures will greatly help your constituents have greater security and stability in retirement.

I want to thank the sponsors of HCR 6 for bringing this issue forward. I urge passage of HCR 6. We welcome any efforts by members of the General Assembly to work with their counterparts in Washington to advance the repeal of GPO/WEP.
