My name is Kevin Falvey, a firefighter for Painesville Township Fire Department, Local 3411 (Lake County).

My Story

I have been a firefighter for Painesville Township for 15 years.

Financing Houses To Putting Out Fires In Houses

I attended Kent State University where I received my Bachelor's Degree in Finance. Upon graduation from college in 2003 and immediately took a job working for a large financial institution in Northeast Ohio. In the years that I worked there I was fortunate to post into several different departments within the bank and got a really good sense of what working in Corporate America was like. The pay was good and the people were great, but I quickly found that it wasn't for me. I left that job and went to work at my Father's Real Estate company. It's a small business in Painesville, Ohio that he's owned for close to 40 years. On most days there were three of us in the office, it was quite a different feel. As the real estate market began to take a turn I knew that I needed a more stable job. One day at work he gave me the best advice that I've ever received, he told me that I should go to the fire academy and see what I thought.

Grandfather's Pride of Service

My grandfather, was a career firefighter for the City of Cleveland. My grandfather died too young from a heart attack, but my dad often spoke with a lot of pride about his service. I was in my late 20's and had no knowledge of the fire service. I went to the academy and quickly realized that I had found what I was meant to do. Now, 15 years later I am grateful everyday for this profession.

I have no doubt that if I would have stayed in the world of Finance, I would probably have done pretty well for myself. I certainly didn't join the Fire Service to become rich. Although one of my main motivations for becoming a firefighter was to get into a more stable career that I enjoyed doing, it wasn't until recently that I've realized just how important my benefits and pension are. I'm now 42 years old and have 3 small children at home. I know that so much of my family's financial future depends on having a strong pension system and it's one of the main reasons why I've been able to serve my community for the past 15 years
