I strongly object to HB 103 and I urge you to halt it now in committee. Ohio students and teachers should not serve as guinea pigs by requiring the development of new Ohio standards based on the American Birthright: The Civics Alliance's Model K-12 Social Studies Standards. They especially should not serve as guinea pigs when there is no genuine potential benefit. Ohio students currently benefit from years of investment in Ohio social studies curriculum. Furthermore, making the change to these standards would handicap Ohio students with a curriculum that will endanger their ability to benefit from AP social study courses.
