The introduction of the American Birthright standards states, "We must restore American social studies instruction centered on liberty if we are to restore the American republic to good health."

I'm troubled by the assumption that the country is in poor health. Perhaps the authors have not met the students I've worked with for 20 years—the very bright, diligent, and creative students who I have taught at both private and public schools. But let's assume that the country is ill as the American Birthright standards suggest. Solving an illness takes a critical analysis. It takes breaking down a situation to its core.

A struggling sports team (like my Cleveland franchises) doesn't improve by looking backwards and repeating the same mistakes. It makes the hard decision to change in order to improve, as difficult as that might be. It takes self-reflection. It takes self-reflection that hopefully highlights faults that can be fixed in order to address the illness.

Something I'm still waiting for from my Cleveland Browns. But even they have not reverted to running the early T-formation every play just because it worked for Paul Brown in the 1940s.

If we're truly serious about preparing our students to compete with the best of other countries, some not being so friendly, then we should encourage our students to question our history, not blindly celebrate it.

If the country is broken, we broke it, not our students. But let's entrust them with the sometimes uncomfortable ability to self reflect. Because if we really believe in liberty, then the students should have the liberty to question us.

The American Birthright states that the inspiration for its creation was birthed from fear–a fear that the bedrock of the United States is under attack by an education system that seeks to recruit students into activist organizations with grievances toward the country. Social studies standards should not be conceived by fear; rather, new Ohio standards should be created by positive, yet critical, Ohio educators who are motivated by the enthusiasm of the school year, not the fear of liberty.

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
