HB 339 Proponent Testimony David Claggett 2/13/24

Chair Bird, Vice-Chair Fowler-Arthur, Ranking Member Robinson, and members of the House Primary and Secondary Education Committee, thank you for the opportunity to voice my support for HB 339. My name is Dr. David Claggett and I firmly believe in the cause of nonchartered non-public schools. I am living proof that the education provided in this type of school is effective. I am a 2014 graduate of Licking County Christian Academy a non-chartered nonpublic school located in Heath, Ohio. I received an academic scholarship to The Ohio State University where I graduated Cum Laude with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration.
