Good afternoon, esteemed members of the committee.

Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to speak in strong support of HB 339, the Nonchartered ESA Program. My name is Michael Armbruster. I am both a proud graduate and the current administrator's assistant at Hametown Christian Academy, a small non-chartered non-public school in Norton that represents a critical niche in our educational ecosystem.

Our school curates a personalized learning experience that is meticulously tailored to meet the individual needs of each student – something that, due to their sheer size, larger and public schools often find challenging. This unique approach to education, which is also shared by homeschool co-ops and personal tutoring programs, highlight the necessity of alternative educational models in our system.

The enactment of the Nonchartered ESA Program would mark a significant step forward in recognizing the importance of educational choice, ensuring that no family's decision is limited by financial barriers. It champions the diversity of our educational landscape, acknowledging that each child's needs are unique, and that parents' worldviews should guide their choice of schooling without financial penalty.

We stand at a crossroads where our decisions can either open doors to innovative, customized educational experiences or continue to impose financial burdens that restrict choice and opportunity.
